Early Voting Clerk.

Comments:

Any application received that is not on this form is an "informal application" and may be accepted only if it contains the following information:

- 1. Name and residence address of registration of applicant.
- 2. Address to which ballot is to be mailed.
- 3. Indication of each election for which the voter is applying.
- 4. The ground of eligibility for voting by mail.
- 5. If the ground is absence from the county, an indication that the voter satisfies that ground (provides a mailing address outside the county of residence).
- 6. The signature of the applicant.

If the date on which mail may be received at the address indicated on the application, under reason #4 on the application, is left blank, assume that mail may be received there immediately. Giving the date is optional under #4.

If the voter fails to indicate type and date of election, the clerk should attempt to determine the election for which the voter seeks a ballot. If the clerk cannot determine the election for which the voter is applying, the clerk shall reject the application.
