All organizations must have a Homecoming representative registered with Student Activities. Without a representative, the organization cannot participate in judged Homecoming activities (ex. Parade, Yell Like Hell, Spirit Wall, etc.). **Organizational Contact forms are due Thursday**, **October 1st by 5:00 p.m. to Student Activities located in Union 320.**

Violation of any UNT policy or Homecoming guidelines, including public intoxication will result in immediate disqualification from all Homecoming events.

Judging Criteria and Trophy Classifications

- A. Five categories will be evaluated on a rating scale of 1-6 points, with 6 being the highest, and 30 points being the highest possible amount of points received overall. Judging will be based on the following categories:
 - 1. Originality/Creativity
 - 2. Observance of theme
 - 3. Mean Green Eagle Spirit (enthusiasm and spirit)
 - 4. Craftsmanship (safety, materials used, sturdiness, etc.)
 - 5. Attractiveness (colors, shapes, neatness, etc.)
- B. A panel of judges will consist of representatives from multiple areas of the university community such as faculty/staff, students, alumnae, and community leaders. Judging for Greek floats begins at 2:00 Friday. All other judging will take place on Saturday, October 17th @ 11:30 AM.
- C. BANNERS & TROPHIES will be given before the parade so the winning floats can display them along the parade route.
- CASH AWARDS May be picked up from the Office of Greek Life, Union 422.
 DEADLINE IS Nov. 2 to collect the prize money or the money will be forfeited.
- E. The trophy classifications are:
 - 1. <u>President's Trophy</u>: Best "overall" float. (\$500 cash prize)
 - 2. <u>Greek Eagle Spirit Trophy</u>: Most outstanding entry from Greek campus organizations. (\$400 cash prize) (Second place Greek winner if a Greek team wins the President's Trophy)
 - 3. <u>Honorable Mention: Greek Eagle Spirit</u>: (\$300 cash prize)
 - **4.** <u>Independent Eagle Spirit Trophy</u>: Most outstanding entry from Independent campus organizations. (\$300 cash prize)
 - 5. <u>Scrappy Award:</u> Best float decoration 50% and 50% "Yell Like Hell" participation (\$400 cash prize)
 - 6. Honorable Mention: Scrappy Award: (\$200 cash prize)
 - **7.** <u>Eagle Claw Award</u>: 50% "spirit wall" decoration and 50% "Yell Like Hell" participation. (\$400 cash prize).
 - 8. <u>UNT Departmental Spirit Trophy</u>: Most outstanding entry from a department in the University. (\$300 cash prize)
 - **9.** <u>N.T. Friendship Trophy</u>: Most outstanding entry from non-university organizations.
 - 10. <u>McAdow Marching Unit Trophy</u>: Best non band marching entry.
 - **11.** <u>Corporate Trophy</u>: Most outstanding entry from area business.
 - **12.** <u>Mean Green Award:</u> Best use of recycled materials and/or support toward using a recycled theme in conjunction with the homecoming theme (\$300 cash prize)

UNT Homecoming Parade Rules and Regulations/Students

- 1. <u>All</u> applications must be submitted to Student Activities, union 320 by October 14th, 2009.
- 2. Only those entries checking in at the designated line-up area will be allowed to participate. Units **may not** join the route in progress.
- 3. The maximum height of each float is 12ft from the ground. The telephone and electrical wires on the parade route make this requirement necessary. The width of the floats shall not exceed 8ft. This is necessary for the floats to make the turns along the parade route. The length shall not exceed 50 feet including the pulling vehicle. Each float is limited to one pulling vehicle. Violations of measurements may be grounds for disqualification.
- 4. If a float is decorated in a way that is not in good taste or might be offensive to the City of Denton or UNT, it will be disqualified and not permitted in the parade.
- 5. One entry per group, one vehicle per entry! In the event an automobile or pick-up truck is used as an entry, there may be only one (1) vehicle for each organization or group. (i.e. a truck with trailer is one entry, a truck with float is one entry: one group may not use three convertibles to carry their representatives/a car and a pick-up truck cannot represent one organization)
- ITEMS MAY <u>NOT BE THROWN FROM ENTRIES</u>. People walking alongside the entry may distribute items into the crowd. The University will be charged for clean up if a large amount of candy is carelessly tossed leaving our square littered. We want to continue to "Keep Denton Beautiful".
- No alcohol will be tolerated. Consumption of alcoholic beverages at any time while in the parade line will be cause for immediate removal, disqualification / forfeiture of prize money and exclusion from participation in the next year's Homecoming Parade.
- 8. This is a family event. NO MUSIC CONTAINING EXPLICIT LYRICS WILL BE TOLERATED.
- 9. An official organization representative must remain within the designated float at all times.
- 10. Student organizations may allow commercial sponsors to place a sign on the float excluding alcohol distributors and/or bars.
- 11. Any entry with children should have an adult to supervise on the entry to ensure safety.
- 12. Signs should be at least 24" x 36" to be seen from a distance.
- 13. All floats must be mechanically propelled so they can keep the proper interval. This interval is three car lengths behind the preceding float or group and must be maintained throughout the parade.
- 14. Marching Units should perform special maneuvers only at designated points along the parade route. This will help maintain the appropriate distance between entries during the parade.
- 15. All participants with animals must provide cleanup of animal waste immediately behind entry.
- 16. Greek floats must be complete and ready to be judged by Friday, Oct. 16 at 2:00 p.m. Floats will be judged at the location where they are being assembled. Please submit complete address and instructions to find the site if applicable. Bear in mind the judges cannot be at every location at 2:00.
- All Floats are also eligible for the President's Trophy that will be judged separately on Saturday, October 17, at 11:30 AM at the parade line-up on the corner of Welch and Chestnut, parking lots 54 & 55. PLEASE call Student Activities at 565.3807 before 3:00 p.m. on Friday if you must cancel your entry.
- 18. Large Floats & 18 Wheelers line up on either side of Welch St. beginning @ Chestnut St.
- 19. Dumpsters will be located at parking lot 41 Oct. 17 19 for float dismantling. Please put all debris in the dumpsters provided. IF YOU HAVE RECYCLED MATERIAL, PLEASE RECYCLE IN APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS.

The Homecoming Spirit Walls are an approximately $4' \times 8'$ sheet of plywood with a frame that allows for the wall to be stood up.

While the Spirit Wall is provided, each organization will need to provide their own paint or supplies to decorate their wall. Since the Spirit Walls will be displayed outdoors through Homecoming Week, it is recommended that decorations be able to withstand the possibility of bad weather.

Because there are a limited number of Spirit Walls, registration for campus departments and student organizations will be processed on a <u>first come, first served basis</u>. Confirmation will be emailed to the department/organization contact.

Student organizations may pick up their blank wall at the RHA House (1510 West Maple) on Wednesday, October 7th from 1 PM to 4 PM. Because the Spirit Walls are large and fairly heavy, it is a good idea to arrange for a truck to transport the wall.

Completed Spirit Walls must be in the Willis Library Mall by Tuesday, October 13th by 11 AM. Judging of the Spirit Walls will occur at the Homecoming Kickoff Picnic on Tuesday and the winners will be announced at the event. Participating departments and organizations are encouraged to have representation at their wall during the picnic to show their school spirit.

Spirit Walls need to be removed from the Library Mall and returned to the RHA House on Monday, October 19th by noon.

Important Information

The Competition will take place at the Bonfire site on Friday, October 16th, 2009 and will consist of two categories:

- Greek Organizations
- General Student Organizations

Awards will be given to 1st, 2nd & 3rd place.

There will be a MANDATORY meeting in which your Team representatives from each organization must attend. A confirmation letter or e-mail will provide the time and location of the meeting upon receipt of required forms and fees.

For the competition, please keep in mind:

- You must arrive 20 minutes before your performance for check in. If you do not show up to check in, you will not be able to perform.
- A time limit of **NO MORE THAN 2 MINUTES** will be strictly enforced. If you go over the time limit, you will be disqualified. *Remember, this is a spirit competition. You may dance and step, but make sure your performance ties into the homecoming theme which is: Wild with Pride*
- Judging will be based on these categories: Spirit, Creativity, Organization, Time Limit (1-2 minutes), Wild With Pride theme incorporation into show, and Clarity
- You are required to give PBSO at least 48 hours notice if your organization is not able to participate because adjustments will have to be made to the show.
