Teacher Education Admission Requirements:

1. Junior standing (minimum of 60 earned hours)
2. A 2.75 overall GPA and a 2.75 UNT GPA
3. Appropriate THEA scores
(required for ALL persons seeking teacher certification)
 - a. minimum 240 reading, 230 math, 220 writing
 - b. only allowable exemptions: SAT, ACT, TAKS/TAAS
 - c. For THEA testing information:

4. An official degree plan with certification
5. A signed Application for Admission to Teacher Education

- Applications submitted without an appointment are processed within 7-10 business days.
- You must submit an *official degree plan that includes teacher certification courses* at time of application.

State Certification Exams

All certification students must pass state certification exams to become teacher certified in the state of Texas:

#1 Pedagogy and Professional Responsibilities (PPR) – 8-12 or EC-12. This test will cover your knowledge of good teaching practices and the ways in which a professional teacher should behave in school settings.

#2 Content area – The test will cover your knowledge of the subject(s) that you will be teaching as a professional teacher in a school setting.

#3 Texas Oral Proficiency Test (TOPT) – required only for Spanish and French content areas. This will test your fluency*.

 - UNT does not award teacher certification – UNT recommendation teacher certification candidates to the state
 - The State Board for Educator Certification is the entity that awards teacher certification in Texas
 - To be recommended to the state by UNT you must have
 - The appropriate degree posted to UNT transcripts
 - 2.75 UNT, overall, teaching field and education GPAs
 - Passing scores on the appropriate state certification exams
