What the Future Holds: A Glimpse Into Who You are Becoming by Looking at Our Past

The initial beginnings of the University of North Texas Health Science Center at Fort Worth were marked by the opening of the Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1970.

Over the next couple of years TCOM gained their first president and dean, administrators worked out of a renovated house, the anatomy lab was held in a garage apartment, and a student renovated bowling alley became the lecture hall (UNTHSC, 2007).

By June of 1974, the first eighteen student doctors graduated and in May of 1975 the institution



earned state accreditation. The Texas Legislature re-designated the medical school as a health science center in 1993 (UNTHSC, 2007).

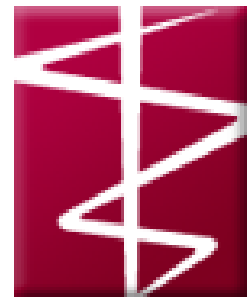
In 1997 the PA program

began accepting students. Just two years later the School of Public Health joined the ranks. This fall, the UNTHSC will welcome its first Doctor of Physical Therapy students.

With four graduate schools, eight research centers, and eighteen community clinics, the UNTHSC strives to reach top ten ranking in all of its educational programs.

It boasts of a computerized center for medical education, an advanced medical library, exemplary rural medicine education, and is home to seven Institutes for Discovery.

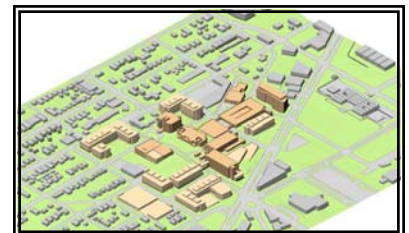


- The first phase of an additional 300,000 square feet of floor space has begun with the construction of Building A, the 112,000 square foot project underway now. Watch as campus grow this fall!

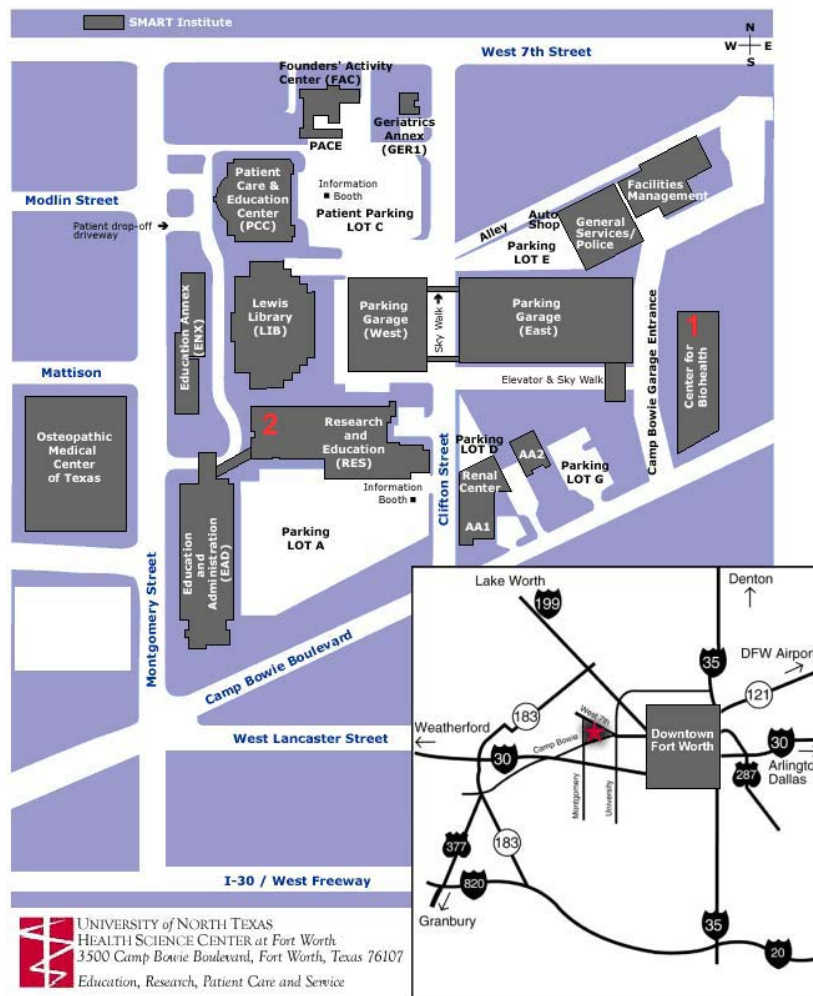

Driving Directions:

From DFW Airport: Follow the south airport exit. Take 360 south to Arlington. From 360 follow signs to I-30 West to Fort Worth. Travel through Arlington to Fort Worth (past Six Flags and the Ballpark). Travel through downtown Fort Worth on I-30 W. Exit Montgomery Dr. and turn right. The UNT HSC will be on the right, at the corner of Montgomery St. and Camp Bowie Blvd.

From Denton: Take I-35 West to I-30 West. Travel through downtown on I-30 W. Exit Montgomery Dr. and turn right. The UNT HSC will be on the right, at the corner of Montgomery St. and Camp Bowie Blvd.

From Dallas: Take I-30 West to Fort Worth. Travel through downtown Fort Worth on I-30 W. Exit Montgomery Dr. and turn right. The UNT HSC will be on the right, at the corner of Montgomery St. and Camp Bowie Blvd.

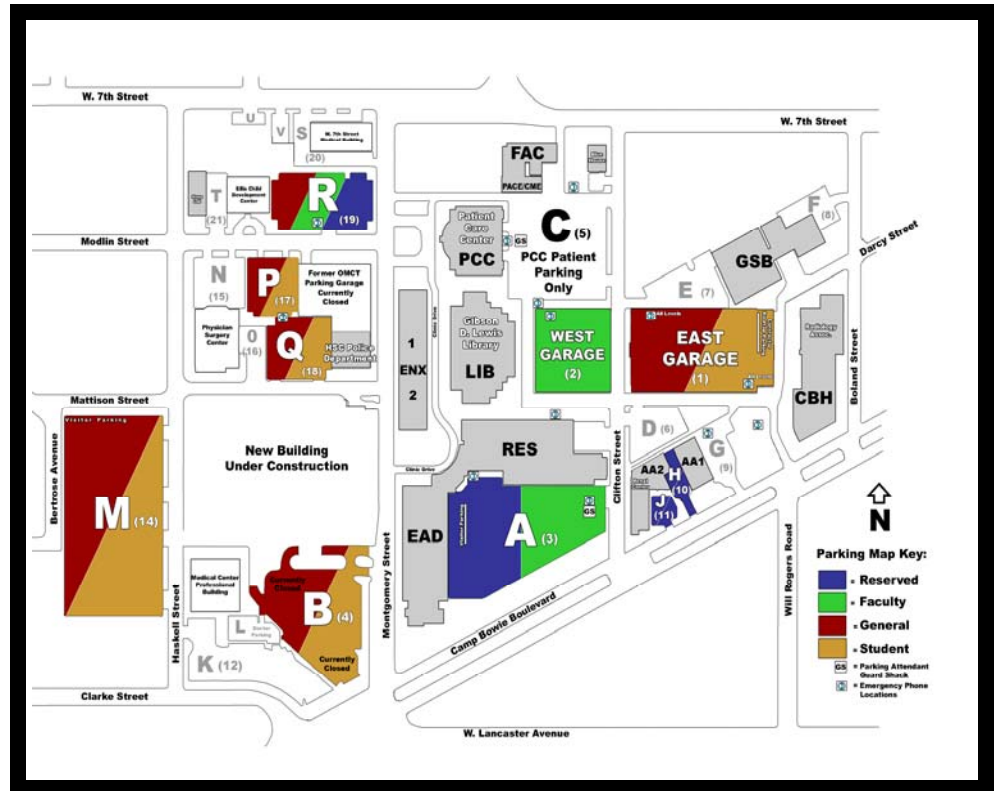
