- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Government Shutdown
- 5 Prevention Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. FUNDING THE GOVERNMENT FOR THE REMAINDER
- 7 OF FISCAL YEAR 2011.
- 8 (a) Deadline for Consideration of Legisla-
- 9 TION FUNDING THE GOVERNMENT FOR THE REMAINDER
- 10 OF FISCAL YEAR 2011.—If the House has not received

a message from the Senate before April 6, 2011 stating that it has passed a measure providing for the appropria-3 tions for the departments and agencies of the Government 4 for the remainder of fiscal year 2011, the provisions of H.R. 1, as passed by the House on February 19, 2011, are hereby enacted into law. 6 7 (b) Publication of Act.—In publishing this Act in 8 slip form and in the United States Statutes at Large pursuant to section 112 of title 1, United States Code, the 10 Archivist of the United States shall include after the date of approval, if applicable, an appendix setting forth the 11 text of the bill referred to in subsection (a). 12 SEC. 3. TREATMENT OF CERTAIN PAYMENTS TO MEMBERS 14 OF CONGRESS AND THE PRESIDENT. 15 (a) Treatment of Members During a Govern-MENT SHUTDOWN.—The Secretary of the Senate and the 16 17 Chief Administrative Officer of the House, respectively, 18 shall not disburse to each Member or Delegate the amount 19 of his or her salary for each day that— 20 (1) there is more than a 24-hour lapse in ap-21 propriations for any Federal agency or department 22 as a result of a failure to enact a regular appropria-23 tions bill or continuing resolution; or 24 (2) the Federal Government is unable to make 25 payments or meet obligations because the public
