CERTIFICATE OF APPORTIONMENT OF \$384,318,790 OF THE APPROPRIATION FOR PITTMAN-ROBERTSON WILDLIFE RESTORATION (CFDA NO. 15.611) TO THE STATES, THE COMMONWEALTH OF PUERTO RICO, GUAM, THE U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS, AMERICAN SAMOA, AND THE COMMONWEALTH OF THE NORTHERN MARIANA ISLANDS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2011.

Pursuant to the Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act, as amended (16 U.S.C. 669 et seq.), I have, at this time, apportioned \$384,318,790 to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands. The funds so apportioned are based on the amount credited during Fiscal Year 2010 to the Federal Aid to Wildlife Restoration Fund. A preliminary apportionment of \$300,083,188 was made on November 29, 2010, and is included as part of this final apportionment. The funds are available for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2010, and are available for the period specified in the Act.

Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$304,836,521 available to the States as provided by Section 4(b) of the Act. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 5 percent or less than one-half of 1 percent of the amount apportioned under Section 4(b). In addition, I have made \$249,568 available in accordance with Section 10(c)(2) of the Act, apportioning this amount in accordance with Section 4(b). Amounts apportioned to the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands are as provided by Section 8A of the Act.


Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$71,232,701 available as provided by Section 4(c) of the Act. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 3 percent or less than 1 percent of the total apportioned under Section 4(c).

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Of the total amount apportioned, I have made \$8,000,000 available as provided by Section 10(a) of the Act. The amounts apportioned to the States are adjusted so that no State shall receive more than 3 percent or less than 1 percent of the total apportioned under Section 10(a). Amounts apportioned to the States, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, Guam, the U.S. Virgin Islands, American Samoa, and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands are as provided by Section 4(c) of the Act.

Therefore, in accordance with the above, the final apportionment of Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration funds for Fiscal Year 2011 is as shown on the enclosed table.
