Solis announced a \$664,074 Recovery Act grant to assist approximately 121 workers affected by layoffs at the RR Donnelley print plant in Spencer, Iowa.</p> <p>"The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, or Recovery Act, is designed to help workers who — through no fault of their own — end up without a job or a paycheck.
