Grants.gov introduced the Opportunity Modification RSS feeds as an alternative to receiving multiple emails for updates to grant opportunities. Now applicants can receive and view all new grant opportunities and updates to existing grant opportunities listed in one place.

Viewing the RSS Feed

- In order to view the RSS feeds, users must first download an RSS Feed Reader
- Some web browsers, such as the current versions of Firefox and Safari have built-in RSS Readers (no need to download RSS Reader in this case)
- The way the grant opportunity listing appears to the applicant depends on the RSS Feed Reader they are using



(install an RSS Feed Reader on your computer, or use a web browser with a built-in RSS Feed Reader like the current version of Firefox or Safari)

If you are using a web browser with a built in RSS Feed Reader, just click on the RSS Feed you want to subscribe to (RSS feeds are sorted by agency and category)

What is RSS?

RSS stands for Really Simple Syndication. It's an easy way to keep up with news and information that's important to you, and helps avoid browsing or searching for information on websites. Now the content you want can be delivered directly to you without littering your inbox with e-mail messages.

What is an RSS Reader?

An RSS reader is a small software program that collects and displays RSS feeds. It allows you to scan headlines from a number of news sources in a central location.

Where can I get an RSS Reader?

Some browsers, such as the current versions of Firefox and Safari have built in RSS readers. If you are using a browser that doesn't currently support RSS, there are a variety of [RSS readers](#) [[EXIT Disclaimer](#)] available on the web; most are free to download while others are available for purchase.

How do I use RSS Feeds?

The way an RSS feed is added to an RSS reader is slightly different from one reader to the next. Follow the directions below to add a new feed (a feed is also referred to as a ?channel) to your RSS reader:

- [BottomFeeder](#) - A Smalltalk, desktop RSS Reader. Open source, runs on Windows, Mac, and various Unix flavors.

- **[FeedDemon](#) ★** - Stand alone feedreader. Has the ability to watch for particular keywords. Supports all versions of RSS and Atom 0.3.
- [Active Web Reader](#) - Free aggregator. Supports RSS feed formats 0.9x, 1.x and 2.x. Requires Internet Explorer 6 or higher.
- [ActiveFeeds RSS Toolbar](#) - A customizable toolbar that adds RSS capability to Internet Explorer.
- [Aggie](#) - A .NET based open source application for reading RSS feeds. Supports RSS versions 0.91, 0.92, 0.93, 0.94, 1.0, and 2.0.
- [Awasu](#) - Free RSS client, allowing monitoring of a variety of news sites and weblogs. Using plugin architecture, can also be customized to monitor databases, email accounts, and other resources.
- [BitsCast](#) - A free rich media RSS reader/aggregator integrating Microsoft JET database engine with rich media (news, audio, video and software delivery).
- [blogbot for Outlook](#) - Blogbot for Outlook is an RSS/Atom/weblog aggregator that plugs into Microsoft Outlook 2000/XP/2003. It monitors subscriptions to Internet news feeds and delivers new posts to folders within Outlook.
- [blogbot lite](#) - RSS/Atom news and weblog application integrated with Internet Explorer in a sidebar.
- [Chaos Wallpaper](#) - A utility that rotates desktop wallpaper while displaying RSS or Atom feeds on the desktop.
- [CITA RSS Aggregator](#) - Free full function aggregator that can also deliver bittorrents. Can access feeds secured by user ID and password. Includes tool to remove adverts from feeds. Requires .NET Framework.
- [Composite](#) - A free desktop RSS/RDF aggregator application for .NET.
- [cRSSReader](#) - Freeware .Net based desktop RSS news reader. Has the capability to save articles.
- [CyberBuddy](#) - CyberBuddy is a freeware application that delivers a variety of content to your desktop, including RSS News Feeds, via talking agent characters.
- [EffNews RSS Reader](#) - The EffNews RSS Reader is a minimalist RSS reader (not aggregator) for Windows. The reader is shipped as part of the effbot.exe application framework - a freely

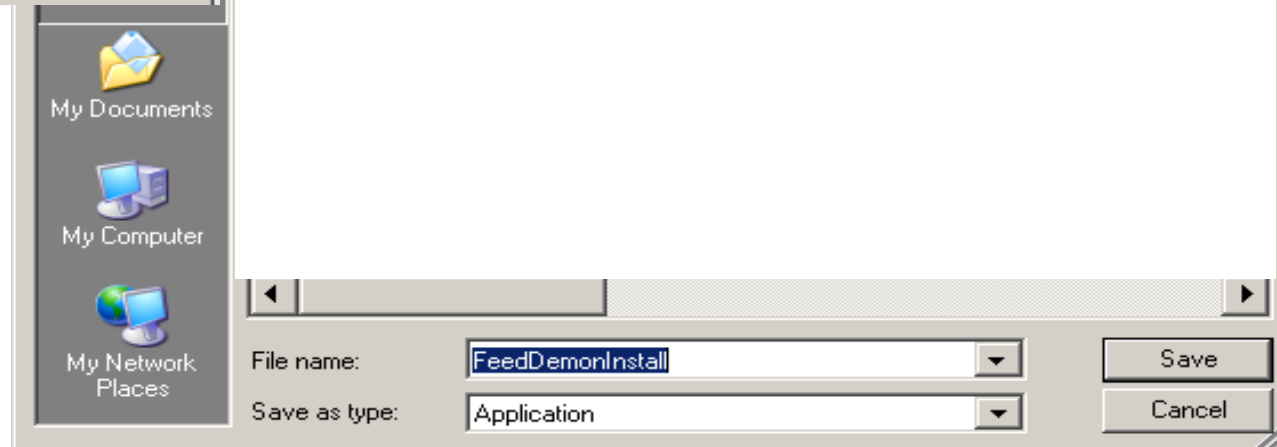
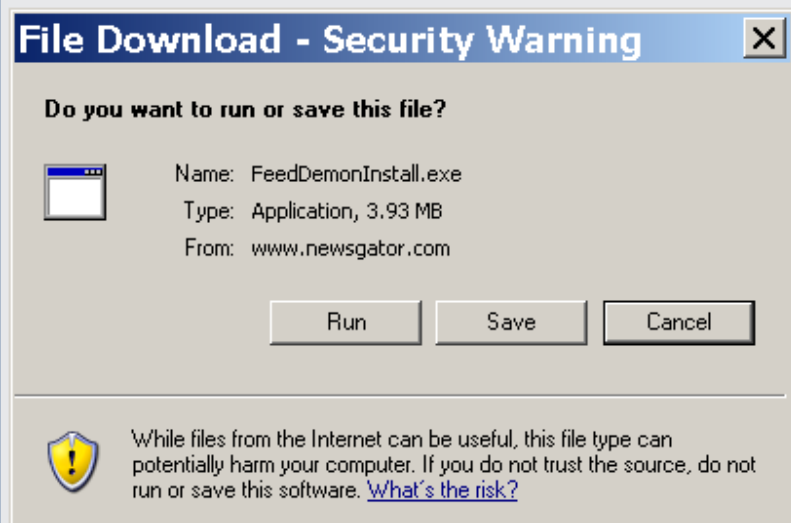

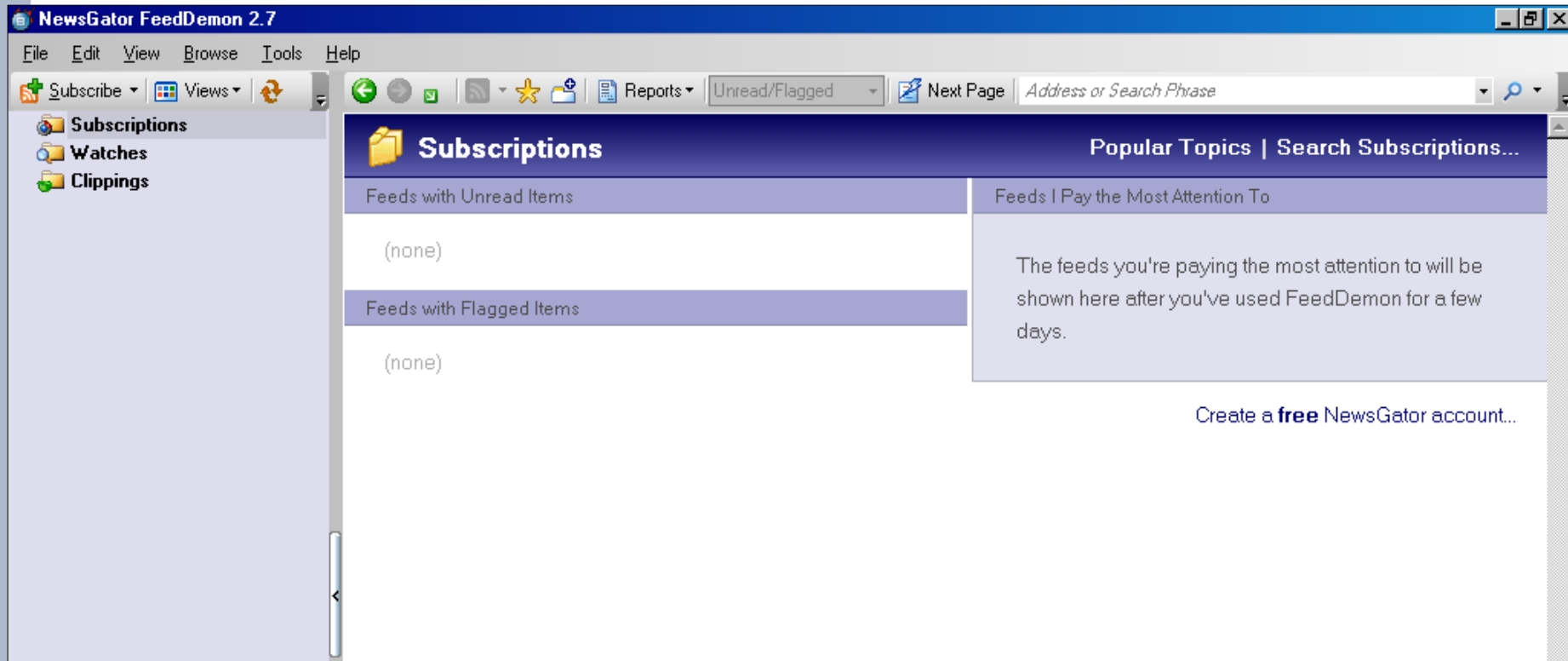
Save the RSS Feed Reader on your computer

(Save the RSS Feed Reader by following this instructions on the dialog boxes below)



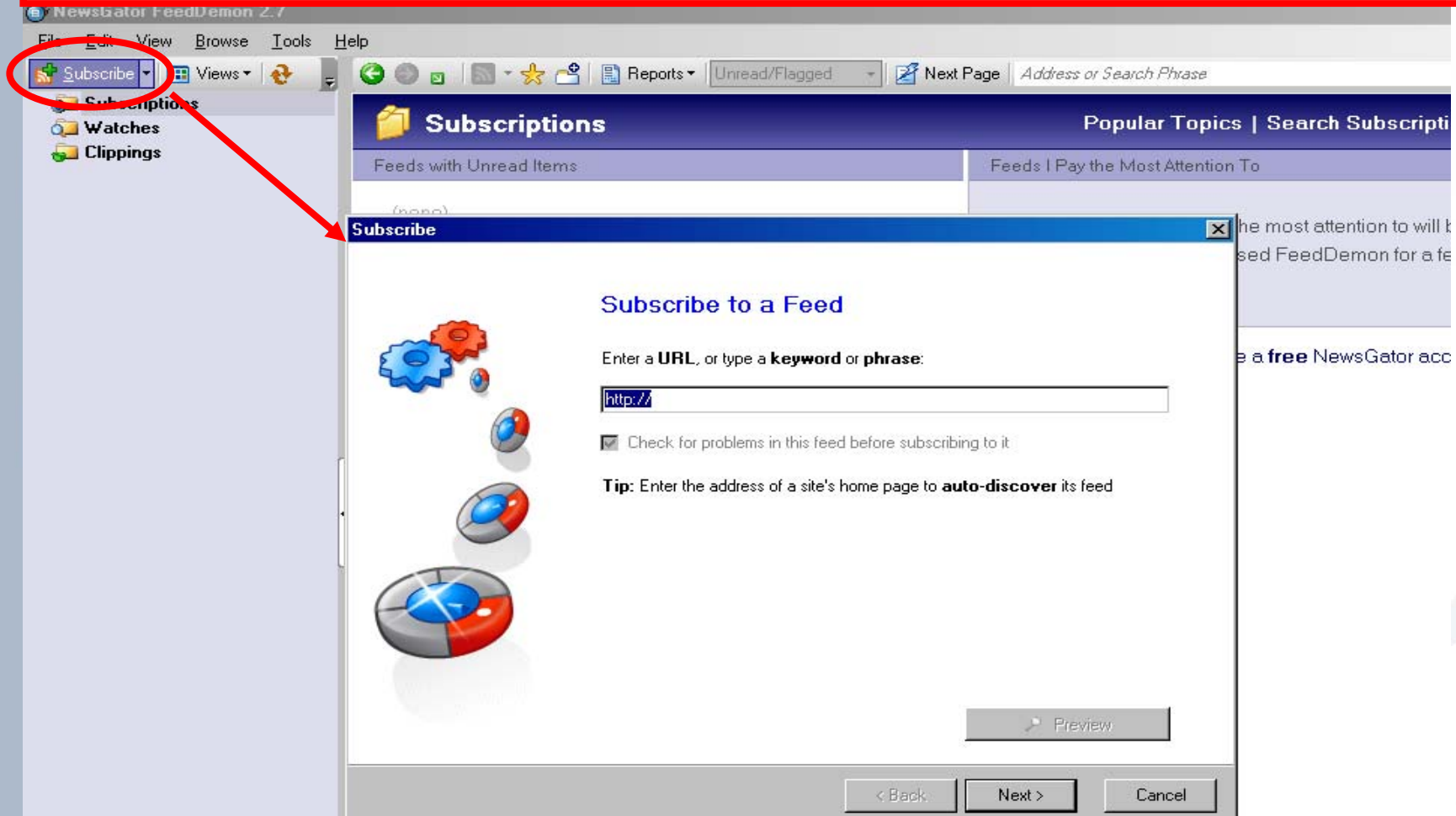
Installing an RSS Feed Reader

Once the RSS Feed Reader is downloaded, a similar user screen will appear and you are ready to begin subscribing to the Opportunity Modification RSS Feeds.



Subscribing to an RSS Feed

Click the “Subscribe” link and a dialog box will open, copy and paste the RSS Feed link that you want to subscribe to (Grants.gov RSS feed links are displayed on the next page)




Subscribing to an RSS Feed

After you copy and paste these RSS Feed links click “Next”

Please note: You will only be able to enter one subscribe to one RSS Feed link at a time



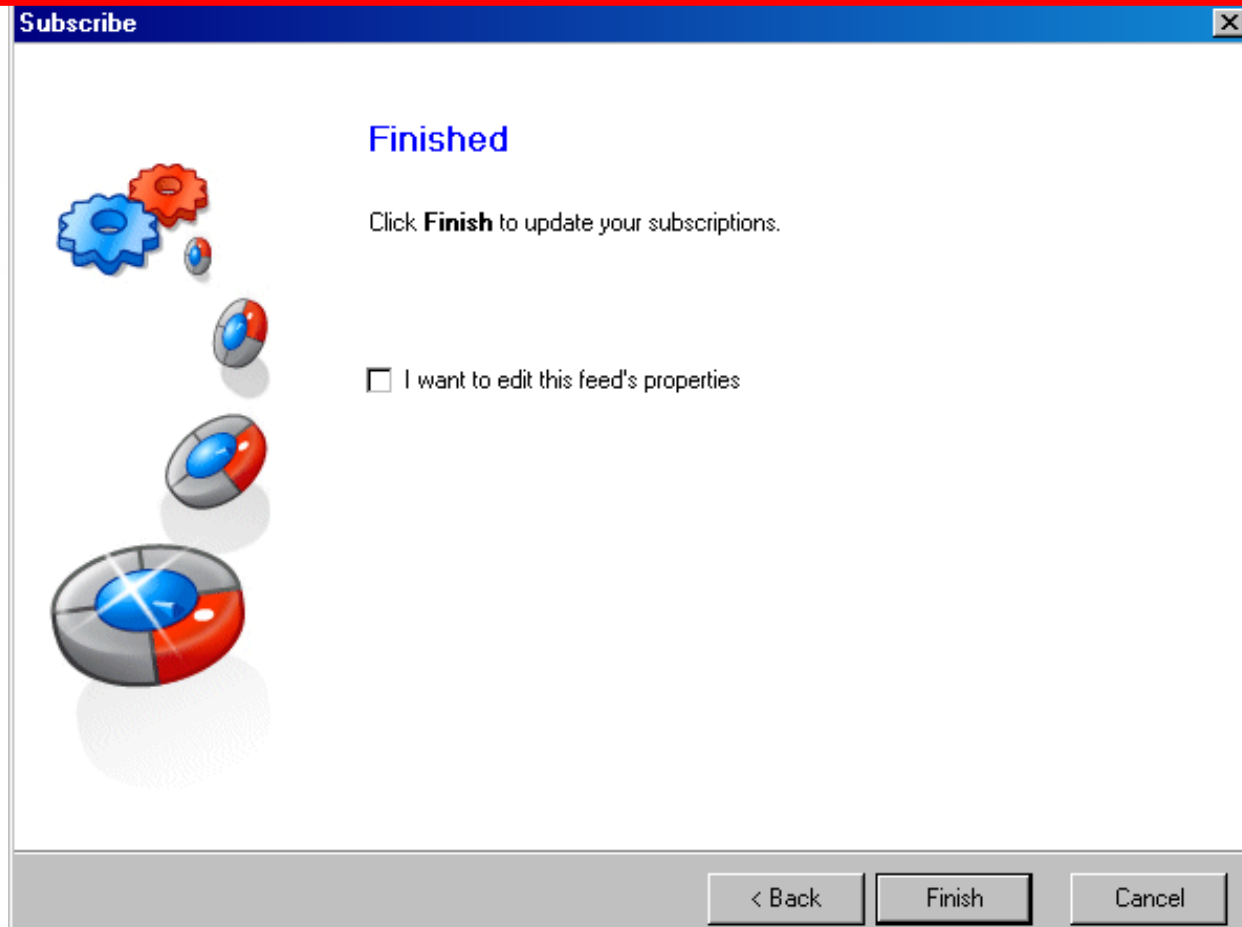


