Dear Ms. Baker:

On behalf of the Fifth Ward Community Redevelopment Corporation, we request to intervene in the consideration of the petition filed by the Federal Home Loan Bank of Dallas ("Dallas Bank") seeking approval of membership for Washington Mutual Bank, F.A. The Fifth Ward Community Redevelopment Corporation (CRC) represents one of the poorest communities in Houston, Texas and provides a quality of life through rental and homeownership for families that otherwise not experience decent, safe and affordable housing. Our ability to provide such has been largely in part to the support of our efforts by the Federal Home Loan Bank and Bank United.

We understand that with Washington Mutual's acquisition of Bank United that Bank United is no longer be permitted to be a member of the Dallas Bank. Washington Mutual has applied to the Dallas Bank to maintain an equivalent membership, and the Dallas Bank has approved this application subject to the approval of the Federal Housing Finance Board. We believe it is in the best interest of the Dallas Bank and the communities it serves for the Finance Board to approve this membership petition.

Fifth Ward CRC has partnered with Washington Mutual's predecessor and the Dallas Bank to promote home ownership in our communities through programs such has the Helping Hands program, and the Affordable Housing Program which provides principal reduction/down-payment, and closing cost grants. In addition, other Dallas Bank programs have enable us to develop multi family affordable rental housing. Of the more than 160 units of single family homes and 24 units of newly constructed multi-family units developed in the 5th Ward, the Federal Home Loan Bank of Dallas has participated in approximately 90% of these developments. Our mission to redevelop this historic community through homeownership is certainly measured by our ability to deliver, and with the Federal Home Loan Bank of Dallas, we have and continue to help had make a difference in the lives of the people.
