### Chamber Action

*Routine Proceedings, pages S349–S369*

**Measures Introduced:** Nineteen bills and two resolutions were introduced, as follows: S. 224–242, and S. Res. 34–35. **Page S359**

**Measures Passed:**

*Condemning Attack on Coptic Christians in Egypt:* Committee on Foreign Relations was discharged from further consideration of S. Res. 22, condemning the New Year's Day attack on the Coptic Christian community in Alexandria, Egypt and urging the Government of Egypt to fully investigate and prosecute the perpetrators of this heinous act, and the resolution was then agreed to. **Page S368**

*National School Counseling Week:* Senate agreed to S. Res. 34, designating the week of February 7 through 11, 2011, as "National School Counseling Week". **Page S368**

*National Data Privacy Day:* Senate agreed to S. Res. 35, expressing support for the designation of January 28, 2011 as National Data Privacy Day. **Pages S368–69**

*FAA Air Transportation Modernization and Safety Improvement Act—Agreement:* A unanimous-consent agreement was reached providing that at 2:15 p.m., on Tuesday, February 1, 2011, Senate begin consideration of S. 223, to modernize the air traffic control system, improve the safety, reliability, and availability of transportation by air in the United States, provide modernization of the air traffic control system, reauthorize the Federal Aviation Administration. **Page S369**

A unanimous-consent-time agreement was reached providing that at 1 p.m., on Thursday, February 3, 2011, Senate proceed to a period of morning business until 3 p.m., with Senators permitted to speak for up to 10 minutes for the purpose of giving remarks relative to the upcoming centennial of the birth of President Ronald Reagan; provided further, that at 3 p.m., on Thursday, February 3, 2011, Senator Manchin be recognized for up to 25 minutes to give his maiden speech to the Senate. **Page S369**
