
Using the Main Menu

When using the NAFRI M-581 Fire Program Manager Online Course Module (OCM), a few tips are necessary for smooth navigation!

The course is set up with an Introduction and eight lessons, which you may access from the Main Menu.



Although it is recommended that you begin with the Introduction, it is not necessary to take the lessons in order.

Navigation Basics

Once you open a module, you will see a welcome screen. At the bottom of the screen, there will be a navigation menu. You can pause, move ahead, or move back by selecting the corresponding button along the bottom of the screen.



Standard buttons will appear in the same location on every screen for ease of use. An explanation of each standard button is provided in the table below.

Button	Function	Description
Outline Narration Search	Tabs	The Outline tab allows the user to view the slides of the presentation in an outline view. You may use this feature in addition to the Back and Next arrows to navigate through the lesson.
		The Narration tab allows the user to view the narration text.
		The Search tab allows the user to search for keywords in the training.
	Next	Displays the next screen in the presentation sequence.
BACK	Back and Next	Displays the previous or next lesson section, respectively, in the presentation sequence.
	Audio Options	Allows the user to turn the volume up or down.
