

# What the JET Does

- Establish a link between the NGB, supported and supporting states
- Assist with the collection, reporting and sharing of information.
- Coordinate with Federal, State, local and other NG resources to facilitate required support (EMAC, JIEE, etc.)

## JET Tiered Response

- <u>Tier 1 Response</u>: State requests one NGB LNO to assist
- <u>Tier 2 Response</u>: State requests a NGB JET to assist with large or small events that require a wider range of expertise.
- <u>Tier 3 Response</u>: State requests a NGB JET with Support Cell to assist with severe events.
- Response depends on the need of the affected state and is tailored at the State's request.

### Establishing a link between the National Guard Bureau and states



**Mission:** The purpose of the National Guard Bureau Joint Enabling Team (JET) is to provide critical NGB Joint Staff, Army and Air National Guard expertise to support the state during a crisis event. In essence, when a disaster strikes - NGB will be there with expertise to assist with reporting and coordination of NGB support.

As a crisis emerges or occurs, NGB J3 will contact the state to determine JET request. NGB JETs and their Support Cells will be notified via the NGB JOC Warning Order and then later, the Execution Order. The Warning Order will identify the situation and designate the Team that will respond. JETs will deploy to be on station within 24 hours of decision to execute. JETs have satellite phones, laptops and printers, cell phones, communications gear and any other equipment needed to ensure a successful mission without imposing a burden on the State to provide what they need. The Team will arrive self-sufficient and sustaining.

NGB can field up to four JETs simultaneously composed of personnel from J1, J2, J3, J4, J6, Public Affairs, ANG, and ARNG representatives to ensure that each team accurately reflects the expertise from NGB. The top Subject Matter Experts from each section will be selected for each of the four teams.

In addition, Support Cells to the NGB JETs may be attached to provide vital additional support to the team and the JFHQ-State. Cell members may include Administrative NCOs, JAG personnel, Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC) experts, Air Coordination Officers, etc.
