Cleveland Museum of Natural History Hypertension Health Talk Cleveland, OH

The Cleveland Museum of Natural History partnered with Case Western Reserve University's Frances Payne Bolton School of Nursing, inviting graduate students to present public health programs as part of their coursework. One student team developed and implemented a Health Talk for young Museum visitors and their families on hypertension. Children were taught the definition of blood pressure, shown physical effects of having high blood pressure, and learned to identify heart-friendly foods. The nursing students approached this topic in a way that was fun, engaging and very hands-on! About 25 children visited the CMNH Health Classroom specifically to be a part of the program on March 2nd, 2012—all were intrigued by the various activities and had many questions for the nursing students. As a 'thank-you' for participating, all the kids earned a heart-healthy snack (apples and oranges)!
