How do I best articulate my skills and past experience to a potential employer so they understand what skills and abilities I possess?

- •Skills resume if applying to job with resume
- Action words to describe job responsibilities on both resume and application
- Prepare for interview to let employer know what you know
- •Describe successes and achievements in previous employment
- •Research company to familiarize yourself with what they do



What are manufacturing employers looking for right now? What skills and attributes? Should I go back to school for additional education or training?

- •Soft skills such as being dependable, reliable, team player are important to every employer
- •Willing to learn
- •Back to school if wanting to learn a new skill, factor in cost, time and willingness to learn

Mistakes to avoid in interview or other contact with potential employer

- •NOT PROPERLY DRESSED OR GROOMED FOR THE INTERVIEW
- •NOT ENGAGED IN THE INTERVIEW PROCESS
- •WRITTEN COMMUNICATION FILLED WITH ERRORS AND MISTAKES
- **•POOR TELEPHONE ETIQUETTE**
- •LATE FOR INTERVIEW
- •NOT WHO YOU KNOW, IT'S WHAT YOU KNOW
