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This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because it uses general and special transfer authority, exceeds established reprogramming thresholds and initiates new starts. This reprogramming action provides funding in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which originally appropriated; and are determined to be necessary in the national interest. They meet all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have previously been denied by the Congress.

<u>Part I</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$69.4 million among Defense appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$28.8 million in general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Division A of Public Law 112-10, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2011; and section 1001 of Public Law 111-383, the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year (FY) 2011.

The NCM3 represents an integral subsystem of fielded AVCATT systems enabling true pilot-crew coordination in a virtual aviation and Integrated Training Environment (ITE). The current AVCATT does not provide the realism, intensity, integration, and training capabilities needed to support aviation collective and combined arms training requirements for the Non-rated Crew Member. Live training is increasingly constrained by cost, time, environmental and safety restrictions, limited maneuver areas and opposing force (OPFOR) representations, and live fire restrictions. The NCM3 better enables aircrew coordination, helicopter gunnery, sling loading, and hoisting training requirements.
