This reprogramming action is submitted for prior approval because this action uses general transfer authority, exceeds established reprogramming thresholds, and affects congressional special interest items. This action reprograms funds in support of higher priority items, based on unforeseen military requirements, than those for which funds were originally appropriated; and is determined to be necessary in the national interest. Some adjustments in this reprogramming impact the Military Intelligence Program (MIP) and are initiatives supported by the Secretary of Defense's Intelligence, Surveillance, and Reconnaissance (ISR) Task Force (TF). They meet all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items has been denied previously by the Congress.

<u>Part I</u> of this reprogramming action realigns \$17.766 million within various Defense Fiscal Year (FY) 2012 appropriations.

<u>Part II</u> of this reprogramming action realigns \$26.370 million of Title IX Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) funding within various Defense FY 2012 appropriations.

<u>Part III</u> of this reprogramming action transfers \$29.3 million between various Defense FY 2011 appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$21.3 million of general transfer authority pursuant to section 8005 of Division A of Public Law 112-10, the Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2011; and section 1001 of Public Law 111-383, the Ike Skelton National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2011.

<u>Part IV</u> of this reprogramming action realigns \$4.711 million of Title IX OCO funding within various Defense FY 2011 appropriations.
