Dear Mr. Chairman:

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5 (the Recovery Act), was designed to stimulate economic growth by creating millions of jobs through investments in infrastructure improvements and expanding energy research in an effort to lead the way toward energy independence for our country. On March 20 and April 28, 2009, the Department submitted its initial plans to implement the Recovery Act, identifying specific military construction (MilCon) and facility sustainment, restoration, and modernization projects that improve facilities and energy efficiency.

At that time, the Department indicated that it would amend the plans if significant changes occurred during implementation. This letter notifies the Congress of the Department's MilCon program changes. This revision adds an Army National Guard project in Montgomery, Alabama, and an Air National Guard project at Dobbins Air Reserve Base, Georgia. The estimated total cost of the two projects is \$4.4 million; these projects will be funded by bid savings realized in their respective appropriations. Enclosure one provides additional project detail.

This letter also includes a revised state summary (enclosure two). The Department appreciates the continued support of the Congress for facility and infrastructure programs. Similar letters have been sent to the chairmen and ranking members of the Senate Armed Services Committee and the Committees on Appropriations of the House and Senate.
