



Hanford Reach National Monument




The Hanford Reach National Monument encompasses 300 square miles around the Hanford Site. Part of the effort to reduce the active footprint of the site involves cleanup of debris sites on Rattlesnake Mountain and the Fitzner-Eberhardt Arid Lands Ecology Reserve. The Hanford Reach was protected by Presidential proclamation in 2000. Past military activity and research in the area has left hundreds of debris sites that the Department of Energy will clean up using funds from the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

 - Demolish 11 excess facilities
 - Clean up nearly 300 debris areas (not contaminated)
