Massachusetts: Where are we?

 In 2008 ~ 32,000 uninsured children (according to the US Census Data)

 In 2010 ~ 3,300 uninsured children (according to the Massachusetts Division of Health Care Finance and Policy)



First Step

- Data Findings in 2009
 - Most uninsured children are from Middlesex county, Western Mass, Suffolk and Plymouth
 - Many of the families with uninsured children face language barriers and fear due to immigration status
 - Latinos and non-English speakers are more likely to be uninsured


Very Next Step...

Campaign Launch

- Launched the "got coverage? Health Coverage For Kids and Teens" campaign
- All kids and teenagers in Massachusetts are eligible for health coverage
- Working group with different partners
- Partnerships with community and faith-based organizations and the ethnic media



Testing an Innovative Model for Covering Hard-to-Reach Children

Phone-A-Thon main components:

- A specific day dedicated to children and teens
- Extended hours at the HelpLine & Volunteers
- Intense outreach:
 - Ethnic Media: Paid and Unpaid
 - TV, Radio, Newspaper
 - Faith-Based
 - Postcard Distributions



What it Took...

- 3 weeks prior to the Phone-A-Thon:
 - 20 Faith-Based network groups and churches
 - 31 Radio Programs (Portuguese & Spanish)
 - 387 Organizations received postcards and posters
 - 49,000+ pieces of collaterals distributed!

What it Took...

Postcards and posters were distributed in different places: consulates, DTA offices,



What it Took...

HCFA purchased media spots for the first time!









Phone-A-Thon Results!

- On September 29th, 2010: 405
 phone calls on the HelpLine
- And 300 new children applied for health coverage

Normally between 150 to 200 children are assisted over a period of three months.


How People Heard About the Phone-A-Thon?

2. Statewide Enrollment Challenge

- In response to Secretary Sibelius's nationwide Connecting Kids to Coverage challenge
- 90+ organizations invited to join the challenge
- 66 organizations across
 Massachusetts participated in the contest



Goal of the Statewide Enrollment Challenge

- Engage Partners Statewide and provide support to their work
- Enroll 500 children during the month of May, 2011



How did it Work?

 Organizations received postcards in 8 different languages: English, Spanish, Portuguese, French, Vietnamese, Mandarin, Swahili, and Haitian Creole.

How did it Work?

- Monetary awards were part of this initiative
 - First Place winner received: \$2,000
 - Second Place winner received: \$1,500
 - Third Place winner received: \$1,000
 - Fourth and fifth received: \$500 each
 - Sixth (drawing) received: \$500



Cash prizes donated by MassHealth Managed Care Organizations (MCOs).

The Successes

 Secretary of Health and Human Services, Judy Ann Bigby, attended the kick-off event and publicly accepted the challenge to enroll all children in Massachusetts on behalf of Governor Deval Patrick.



 We nearly tripled our goal and enrolled 1,479 previously uninsured kids in a single month!
