

BadgerCare+ Toolbox

Covering Kids & Families-Wisconsin

What it is

Most of the 86,000 uninsured children in Wisconsin are likely eligible for BadgerCare+,
the state's public health-care coverage program. Their families need support to
successfully access that coverage. Covering Kids & Families-Wisconsin (CKF) has
developed the BadgerCare+ Toolbox: a free, on-line resource to help schools help
families connect to public health-care coverage.

How it works

School staff may be aware of students who are struggling with health insurance issues,
though they often lack the knowledge and confidence they need to adequately connect
those students to public coverage. The BadgerCare+ Toolbox was developed specifically
for schools -- though anyone can use it. The Toolbox contains information about basic
eligibility for BadgerCare+, as well as promotional materials, outreach ideas, suggestions
for identifying uninsured students, and guidance on helping families apply. The
materials are presented in formats that can be easily integrated into normal school
routines.

Successes

The Toolbox has become the cornerstone for CKF's ongoing work with schools. As the
project is introduced to new areas of the state, the Toolbox is often the key entry point
to engage schools in the work of introducing BadgerCare+ information to families.
 Positive word continues to spread and additional schools and districts – both in
Wisconsin and in other states – are connecting to the Toolbox online and integrating its
components into their everyday processes.

Challenges

CKF's school-based outreach work and the Toolbox have been successful in building the
capacity of school staff as a first point-of-contact for uninsured students and their
families. But school staff need reliable outside support to assist with answering
questions about complex cases and providing in-person application assistance.
Identifying community-based resources for schools remains the biggest challenge, often
because there is a shrinking pool of organizations able to serve this role.

Implementation

• The BadgerCare+ Toolbox stemmed from a four-year pilot project in which CKF partnered with 16 school districts to better understand how schools might be a resource for uninsured students. Costs for initial development and implementation were provided by the Healthier Wisconsin Partnership Program at the Medical College of Wisconsin and the Wisconsin Partnership Program at the University of Wisconsin School of Medicine and Public Health. As CKF's school-based work continues, the content and structure of the Toolbox will expand and be refined.
