

Why Schools?


- School staff are interested and already helping families
- Schools offer a natural environment
- Systems are in place
- With help, staff can be more efficient and effective



Reaching the Uninsured through Schools

- Awareness among eligible families remains incomplete
- There are newly eligible families all the time
- Many other barriers for this population
 - Perceptions (income too high, insurance unnecessary)
 - Complicated family lives with competing priorities
 - Programmatic complexities (paperwork requirements, difficult to navigate alone)
 - Language difficulties and cultural beliefs
- Families trust schools and may prefer learning about and pursuing MA/SCHIP through more familiar environments
- Information campaigns alone may not be enough



Details matter

Protecting Privacy: Letting Parents Opt In and Opt Out

- Opt out = passive consent; if a parent does not take the opportunity the school presents to keep data from being shared, it will be shared when requested
 - Directory Data
 - School Lunch Enrollment Data
- Opt in = informed consent; a parent must affirm his/her willingness to share specified data with specified organizations for specified purposes
 - Data in educational records not considered Directory Data

Types of School Records

- Educational Records any record in any medium, maintained by the school, that is directly related to a student
- Directory data The set of records that can be shared so long as opt out opportunity is provided
- Free and reduced price meal information –
 Information on the applications; can be shared
 so long as opt out and other rules are followed
- Health insurance status Falls outside of data considered Directory Data and thus FERPA optin rules apply

FRPL/NSL Data

USDA guidelines:

- Allows sharing of information between free and reduced price meal programs and state Medicaid and SCHIP programs (does your organization qualify?)
- 2. Must offer families the opportunity to request information NOT be shared (opt out)
- 3. FRPL "determining agency" and MA/SCHIP enrollment agency must enter into a DSA

Directory Data

- FERPA and Wisconsin Statutes authorize school districts to disclose directory data (be sure to check your state statues!) with opt out
- Fields covered in Wisconsin include:
 - name, address, telephone, date of birth
 - weight and height of members of athletic teams,
 - dates of attendance, photographs, degrees and awards received

Health Insurance Status

- School Districts may collect student health insurance status
- School Districts may share health insurance status only when parents/guardians give active consent
- FERPA requires the following elements be included for active consent:
 - Name of student whose record is being released
 - Specify records that may be disclosed
 - State the purpose of the disclosure
 - Identify the party to whom disclosure will be made, and
 - Include the signature of the parent/guardian





- How best to target: FRPL, HIS, both or neither?
- What are the timelines and deadlines for preparing enrollment/data collection materials and forms?
- What is the capacity within and without the district to provide outreach and enrollment assistance?

(More) Key Questions to Answer

Targeting via FRPL?

- Are you considered part of the administration of MA/SCHIP? If not, will your state designate you as such?
- Does the school district already include an "Opt-Out" question or form in its FRPL enrollment process? What, if anything, is done with that information?
- What is the FRPL enrollment process? What is the school enrollment process?

Targeting via HIS?

- Does the district gather health insurance status from students? If not, is it willing to collect it?
- How will the district obtain informed consent to share the data?
