# Legal Aid Society

- Our mission is to resolve serious legal problems of low-income people, promote economic and family stability and reduce poverty through effective legal assistance.
- We provide effective legal advice and advocacy to seven counties in Southwest Ohio.
- Last year, we received 31,401calls for help and opened cases for 7,619 people.
- In 2009, Legal Aid received a CHIPRA Outreach and Enrollment Grant to enroll 1,800 children and retain 425 children into Medicaid.

#### Uninsured Children in Ohio

- In Ohio, nearly 1 in 10 children, almost 77,000, who are potentially eligible for Medicaid, are uninsured.\*
- Ohio's rate of uninsured children has remained low; declining from 5.4% in the 2004 Ohio Family Health Survey to 4.6% in the 2010 Ohio Family Health Survey.
- According to the 2010 Ohio Family Health Survey, the percentage of uninsured 13-18 year olds is estimated at almost 9%.

#### Get Covered – Get in the Game

- Nationwide, roughly 5 million uninsured kids and teens are eligible for Medicaid.
- There are approximately 44 million boys and girls participating in organized youth sports.
- The Get Covered Get in the Game initiative was designed to bring coaches, schools, families and communities together to raise awareness about Medicaid.
- Ohio is one of seven pilot states across the country (the others are Colorado, Florida, Maryland, New York, Oregon, and Wisconsin) who launched this initiative.
- Activities include on-site enrollment opportunities at high school football games throughout the state.

#### Get Covered - Get in the Game Initiative Launches in Ohio on Sept. 10

Program will boost awareness of health coverage available for children

#### BACKGROUND:

Fall sports season is here and it's important to ensure children have the health coverage they need so they're protected on and off the field. With approximately 44 million boys and girls participating in organized youth sports, kids shouldn't be sidelined from their favorite activities because they don't have heath insurance.

Sept. 10 marks the launch of the *Get Covered – Get in the Game* initiative in Ohio, designed to bring coaches, schools, families and communities together to raise awareness about available health coverage and get eligible children enrolled. Roughly 5 million uninsured kids are eligible for health coverage through free, public health care programs like the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and Medicaid. In Southwest Ohio, nearly 18,000 children are uninsured.

Ohio is one of seven pilot states across the country (the others are Colorado, Florida, Maryland, New York, Oregon, and Wisconsin) launching the initiative. Activities include on-site enrollment opportunities at high school football games throughout the state, including the Sept. 10 Princeton High School game versus Glen Este High School, and outreach to various sports groups.

Ohio partners like the Legal Aid Society of Greater Cincinnati offers families free assistance with applying for Medicaid. 
- Building a relationship with the station

- Shifts
  - 12 hours
  - 4-5 volunteer shifts



## **Phonathon Results**

Phonathon	Calls Received	Children Enrolled
April 20, 2011	656	158
December 15, 2011	258	54
September 15, 2010	273	41
March 15, 2010	273	38

#### Reaching Teens Through Phonathons

- Since inception of the CHIPRA grant, Legal Aid has enrolled 321 teenagers
- 115 or 36% of teenagers enrolled, were identified through a Phonahton
