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Advance Report on Durable Goods Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories and Orders August 2011

New Orders. New orders for manufactured durable goods in August decreased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$201.8 billion, the U.S. Census Bureau announced today. This decrease, down two of the last three months, followed a 4.1 percent July increase. Excluding transportation, new orders decreased 0.1 percent. Excluding defense, new orders decreased 0.1 percent. Primary metals, down following five consecutive monthly increases, had the largest decrease, \$0.2 billion or 0.8 percent to \$24.2 billion.

Shipments. Shipments of manufactured durable goods in August, down following three consecutive monthly increases, decreased \$0.4 billion or 0.2 percent to \$201.0 billion. This followed a 2.1 percent July increase. Transportation equipment, down following two consecutive monthly increases, had the largest decrease, \$2.3 billion or 4.6 percent to \$47.1 billion.

Unfilled Orders. Unfilled orders for manufactured durable goods in August, up sixteen of the last seventeen months, increased \$7.6 billion or 0.9 percent to \$878.6 billion. This followed a 0.9 percent July increase. Transportation equipment, up eight consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$6.0 billion or 1.2 percent to \$507.6 billion.

Inventories. Inventories of manufactured durable goods in August, up twenty consecutive months, increased \$3.2 billion or 0.9 percent to \$365.3 billion. This was at the highest level since the series was first published on a NAICS basis in 1992 and followed a 1.1 percent July increase. Transportation equipment, also up twenty consecutive months, had the largest increase, \$1.4 billion or 1.3 percent to \$112.3 billion.

Capital Goods. Nondefense new orders for capital goods in August increased \$3.9 billion or 5.2 percent to \$78.1 billion. Shipments increased \$1.9 billion or 2.7 percent to \$71.3 billion. Unfilled orders increased \$6.7 billion or 1.3 percent to \$516.9 billion. Inventories increased \$1.9 billion or 1.1 percent to \$166.8 billion. Defense new orders for capital goods in August decreased \$0.5 billion or 5.7 percent to \$7.7 billion. Shipments increased \$0.2 billion or 2.9 percent to \$7.5 billion. Unfilled orders increased \$0.2 billion or 0.1 percent to \$151.5 billion. Inventories increased \$0.1 billion or 0.7 percent to \$20.6 billion.

Revised July Data. Revised seasonally adjusted July figures for all manufacturing industries were: new orders, \$452.8 billion (revised from \$453.2 billion); shipments, \$452.2 billion (revised from \$453.2 billion); unfilled orders, \$871.0 billion (revised from \$870.4 billion); and total inventories, \$599.3 billion (revised from \$598.0 billion).

The Capital Goods Industries include Nondefense: small arms and ordnance; farm machinery and equipment; construction machinery; mining, oil, and gas field machinery; industrial machinery; vending, laundry, and other machinery; obtoodraphic equipment; metalworking machinery; turbines and generators; other power transmission equipment; pumps and compressors; material handling equipment; all other machinery; electroic computers; computer storage devices; other computer peripheral equipment; communications equipment; decroment; electromedical, measuring, and control instruments; electrical equipment; other electrical equipment, appliances, and components; heavy duty trucks; aircraft; railroad rolling stock; ships and boats; office and institutional furniture; and medical equipment and supplies.

Defense Capital Goods include: small arms and ordnance, communications equipment, aircraft; missiles, space vehicles, and parts, ships and boats, and search and navigation equipment.

⁴ Estimates of shipments for the semiconductor industry are no longer shown separately. Estimates and percent changes of shipments and inventories for the semiconductor industry are included in computers and electronic products, and all other applicable aggregate totals. Estimates and percent changes for new orders and unfilled orders exclude semiconductor industry data.

Survey Description

This report is compiled from results of the U.S. Census Bureau's Manufacturers' Shipments, Inventories, and Orders (M3) survey. This survey provides statistics on manufacturers' value of shipments, new orders (net of cancellations), end-of-month order backlog (unfilled orders), end-of-month total inventory (at current cost or market value), and inventories by stage of fabrication (materials and supplies, work-in-process, and finished goods). The M3 includes approximately 4,300 reporting units. Units may be divisions of diversified large companies, large homogenous companies, or single-unit manufacturers in 89 industry categories. Due to the small monthly sample, these 89 categories have been combined into 65 publication levels. The survey methodology assumes that the month-to-month changes of the total operations of those companies in the monthly survey effectively represent the month-to-month movements of all establishments that make up the category. The current coverage levels in the survey show that reported data in the monthly survey represent approximately 60 percent of the shipments estimates at the total manufacturing level. Data published represent manufacturing in a calendar month. The data collection is based on a voluntary survey authorized by Title 13 of the United States Code.

The data presented in this release are based on data obtained from a panel of 4,300 reporting units and provide an indication of the activity within the manufacturing sector. The results differ from what would be obtained from a complete enumeration of all manufacturing companies. In addition, a different panel of 4,300 companies would yield different results. The M3 panel is comprised of companies with \$500 million or more in shipments and a limited number of smaller companies. From a statistical perspective, the panel is not a probability sample; therefore, the sampling errors that are normally provided with sample surveys cannot be measured. Nonsampling errors are attributable to many sources. The use of company or divisional reports to estimate the monthly change for establishments is one source of nonsampling error. The use of primarily large companies to represent the month-to-month movement of all companies is another potential source. Any corrections will be published in the full report. Corrections received after the full report will be released in the next month's advance report. Any revisions made later than two months will be reflected in the annual benchmark publication.
