



Foster Grandparent Program and Senior Companion Program 2009 Schedule of Income Eligibility Levels February 17, 2009

SUMMARY: This Notice revises the schedules of income eligibility levels for participation in the Foster Grandparent Program (FGP) and the Senior Companion Program (SCP) of the Corporation for National and Community Service, published at the Senior Corps website, www.seniorcorps.gov, in February 2008. The list of High Cost Areas has been significantly revised for 2009.

DATES: These guidelines are effective as of the publication of the Department of Health and Human Services Poverty Guidelines, January 23, 2009.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The revised schedules are based on changes in the Poverty Guidelines issued by the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), published in the *Federal Register*, Vol. 74, No. 14, pp. 4199–4201, January 23, 2009. In accordance with program regulations, the income eligibility level for each State, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands and the District of Columbia is 125 percent of the DHHS Poverty Guidelines, except in those areas determined by the Corporation to be higher in cost of living based on application of the Volunteers in Service to America (VISTA) subsistence rates. In such instances, the guidelines shall be 135 percent of the DHHS Poverty levels. The level of eligibility is rounded to the next higher multiple of \$5.00.

An updated list of High Cost Areas is included below, consistent with current VISTA subsistence rates. Where a grantee serves a county or city that was on the list of High Cost Areas in 2008, but is no longer on this list, any volunteer who met the applicable income guideline in effect in 2008 may continue serving as a Foster Grandparent or Senior Companion as long as their annual income review indicates that the volunteer's income is within 135 percent of the DHHS poverty guidelines. However, all newly recruited or returning volunteers must meet the current income eligibility level that applies to their county or city.

In determining income eligibility, consideration should be given to the following, as set forth in 45 CFR 2551-2552 dated October 1, 1999, as amended per the *Federal Register*, Vol. 67, No. 188, Friday, September 27, 2002, Vol. 69, No.72, Wednesday, April 14, 2004, and Vol. 69, No. 75, Monday, April 19, 2004.

- Allowable medical expenses are annual out-of-pocket expenses for health insurance premiums, health care services, and medications provided to the applicant, enrollee, or spouse, which were not and will not be paid for by Medicare, Medicaid, other insurance, or by any other third party, and which do not exceed 50 percent of the applicable Corporation income guideline.
- Annual income is counted for the past 12 months, for serving SCP and FGP volunteers, and is projected for the subsequent 12 months for applicants to become SCP and FGP volunteers.
- Annual income includes the applicant or enrollee's income and the applicant or enrollee's spouse's income, if the spouse lives in the same residence. Sponsors must count the value of shelter, food, and clothing, if provided at no cost by persons related to the applicant, enrollee or spouse.
- Any person whose income is not more than 100 percent of the DHHS Poverty Guideline for her/his specific family unit shall be given special consideration for participation in the Foster Grandparent and Senior Companion Programs.

Clarification regarding Food Stamps: For eligibility purposes, income does not include the value of food stamps provided under the Food Stamp Act of 1977, as amended.

Authority: These programs are authorized pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 5011 and 5013 of the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973, as amended. The income eligibility levels are determined by the current guidelines published by DHHS pursuant to Sections 652 and 673(2) of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1981 which requires poverty guidelines to be adjusted for Consumer Price Index changes.
