#### **PURPOSE**

The American Recovery Reporting Act (ARRA), Section 1512, requires grant recipients to provide at least one "Activity Code" to identify their program's purpose in their quarterly reporting to FederalReporting.gov. Grant recipients must use the activity codes from one of the following systems:

- National Taxonomy of Exempt Entities Nonprofit Program Classification (NPC) at http://nccsdataweb.urban.org/PubApps/nteeSearch.php?codeType=NPC
- North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes (for infrastructure projects, only) at http://www.census.gov/eos/www/naics/

The section below provides a list of recommended NTEE-NPC and NAICS codes for each U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) Recovery Act solicitation. Grant recipients may select from any of the listed activity codes that best describes their organization's purpose or visit the system's Web site above to choose a more applicable activity code.

The CFDA number for each DOJ program is also included in the information below.

#### **PROGRAMS**

### Recovery Act - Grants to State Sexual Assault and Domestic Violence Coalitions CFDA: 16.556

**Objective:** The State Coalitions Program funds three types of statewide coalitions: sexual assault, domestic violence and dual. Statewide sexual assault coalitions provide direct support to member rape crisis centers through funding, training and technical assistance, public awareness activities, and public policy advocacy (e.g., state coalitions might work with law enforcement, prosecution, faith-based and community organizations to enhance their responses to victims of sexual assault). Statewide domestic violence coalitions provide comparable support to member battered women's shelters and other domestic violence victim service providers. Dual coalitions provide both types of support to a membership that includes both domestic and sexual violence service providers.

# Recovery Act - Tribal Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Coalitions Grant Program

CFDA: 16.557

**Objective:** The Tribal Coalitions grants will support increasing awareness of domestic violence and sexual assault against American Indian and Alaska Native women; enhancing the response to violence against American Indian and Alaska Native women at the tribal, Federal, and state levels; and identifying and providing technical assistance to coalition membership and tribal communities to enhance access to essential services for American Indian women victimized by domestic and sexual violence.

### Recovery Act - STOP (Services Training Officers Prosecutors) Violence Against Women Formula Grant Program)

CFDA: 16.588

**Objective:** This program supports communities in their efforts to develop and strengthen effective law enforcement, prosecution and court responses to violence against women and to provide services to victims. OVW encourages States to target Recovery Act funding to hiring and retaining criminal justice and victim services personnel, as well as supporting other strategies that create and preserve jobs and promote economic growth while improving responses to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking.

#### Recovery Act - Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force Program (ICAC)

CFDA: 16.800

**Objective:** The Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force Program seeks to maintain and expand State and regional ICAC task forces to address technology-facilitated child exploitation. These task forces work collaboratively as a national network of law enforcement and prosecutorial agencies that prevent, interdict, and investigate Internet crimes against children. The program requires existing task forces to develop multijurisdictional, multiagency responses to such offenses by providing funding and other support to State and local law enforcement agencies as a means to help them acquire the necessary knowledge, personnel, and equipment.
