Recovery Act Section 1512(c) Reporting

- DOJ Recovery Act grant recipients with awards of \$25,000 or more are required to submit Section 1512(c) reports on a quarterly basis.
- Most data fields are cumulative (report activity from the beginning of the project period to the end of the current reporting period).
- Job data are reported quarterly (report the number of FTEs from January 1, 2010 to March 31, 2010).





Reporting Process Timeline

Recipients have until the 10th day following the end of the quarter to submit the Section 1512(c) data.

- April 1 10: Prime recipients and delegated subrecipients submit reports.
- April 11 12: Prime recipients review subrecipient submitted reports. Prime and subrecipients correct reports.
- April 13 29: Federal agencies review and comment on the Section 1512(c) reports. Prime and subrecipients correct reports.
- April 30: Recipient data is posted on Recovery.gov.
- May 3 June 14: Prime recipients can continue to modify their data during the Continuous Correction period.
- July 1: The next reporting period begins.





Failure to Submit a Section 1512(c) Report

- Recipients who fail to submit a Section 1512(c) report as required by the terms of their award are considered to be non-compliant. Non-compliant recipients, including those who are persistently late or negligent in their reporting obligations, are subject to Federal action, up to and including the termination of Federal funding or the ability to receive Federal funds in the future.
- Recipients who **do not** submit reports will be identified on the Recovery.gov website.

Introduction





JAG Special Condition Regarding Failure to Comply with the Section 1512(c) Reporting

- After failure to report Section 1512(c) JAG data for two consecutive reporting periods, the recipient may be—
 - (a) precluded from drawing down funds under any OJP award, and/or
 - (b) deemed ineligible for future discretionary OJP awards, until such time as the recipient becomes current in its Section 1512(c) reporting obligations.
- After failure to report Section 1512(c) JAG data for three consecutive reporting periods, the recipient, upon written demand of the Director of BJA, shall return to OJP any unexpended award funds (including any unexpended interest earned on award funds) within 15 calendar days of the date of the demand notice. Thereafter, the recipient's award shall be converted to a cost-reimbursable grant until such time as the recipient becomes current in its Section 1512(c) reporting obligations, and remains current for not less than two additional consecutive reporting periods.

Functionality Update

- 1. Recipients have the ability to change incorrect award number and DUNS numbers.
 - Recipients can change incorrect award and DUNS numbers throughout the reporting period by using the "Change Business Key Information" function. Chapter 10: *Copy Forward and Copy Functions* user guide can be viewed or downloaded at <u>https://www.federalreporting.gov/federalreporting/downloads.do#</u> <u>docs</u>.

- 2. Recipients have the ability to "Copy Forward" a previously submitted or saved report.
 - Recipients may update only the necessary data fields for the quarter.





Functionality Update

- Recipients have the ability to make corrections to the data submitted in the Continuous Correction period from May 3 - June 14, 2010.
- 4. Validates certain data fields, such as the Congressional district, award amount, and job count.
 - Warning Messages: Data questionable; however, the report can still be submitted.
 - Error Messages: Data incorrect and must be corrected in order to submit the report.



Copy Forward



- The FederalReporting.gov "Copy Forward" function allows users to copy forward the data submitted in the previous report and update only the relevant data fields.
- The "Copy Forward" functionality can be accessed directly through the Web browser at FederalReporting.gov.
- This new feature has proven to reduce the number of errors submitted in the Section 1512(c) report.
- DOJ highly encourages all Recovery Act recipients to use the "Copy Forward" function on FederalReporting.gov when reporting.



Copy Forward

- Copy Forward can be used if the recipient created a draft or submitted a report in FederalReporting.gov.
- Copy Forward cannot be used if:
 - No prior report has been submitted.
 - An incorrect award type was submitted on a prior report.

New FederalReporting.gov Functionality > Continuous Quality Assurance



Continuous Quality Assurance Process

- From May 3, 2010 to June 14, 2010 FederalReporting.gov will be available to recipients and Federal agencies to perform Quality Assurance (QA) checks and to correct errors identified during the QA activities.
 - On May 2, 2010, all recipient reports submitted in April will be unlocked and available for recipients and Federal agencies to conduct additional QA. Recipients will be able to correct their reports.
 - DOJ will review any updates made during this period and request incorrect data to be modified by inserting a comment in FederalReporting.gov.
 - DOJ will also conduct a thorough review of a selection of submitted Section 1512(c) reports. The Federal grant manager may contact recipients to request documentation or clarification of the submitted data.

Estimating the Number of Jobs







Section 1512(c) requires recipients to report the **total number** of jobs funded or partially funded through Recovery Act funding (whether created, retained, or existing).

Note: Some DOJ Recovery Act programs restrict the use of Recovery Act funds in connection with supplanting. The following website provides a list of Recovery Act programs that prohibit supplanting and examples of the scope of applicable restrictions.

Calculating the Number of Jobs

How do I calculate Recovery Act funded jobs?

• FTEs are calculated as the number of actual Recovery Act-funded hours worked by employees during the reporting period (calendar quarter) divided by the number of hours representing a full time schedule for *this position in your agency* during the reporting period.

Full Time Schedule Example:

If full-time employment for the created/retained job at Recipient Agency A equals 520 hours for the reporting period, then:

1 FTE = 520 hrs for that reporting period





FTE Calculation Example

Position	Hours Worked	Full Time Schedule	Total FTE
	(A)	(B)	(A divided by B)
IT Specialist	52	520	0.1

52 Hours Worked (A) 520 Hours in Full Time Schedule (B) = .01 FTE





What counts as an FTE?

Do Count

- All existing, created, and retained positions funded directly by Recovery Act dollars or that will be reimbursed using Recovery Act dollars.
 - Compensated employees working in the US or its "outlying areas."
 - Hours worked on or after the award date.
 - Compensated overtime (does not apply to COPS recipients).
 - Compensated as paid leave (PTO, vacation/sick leave, etc.).
 - Employees of the recipient or subrecipient, including personnel hired through a 3rd party (e.g., staffing or temp agency).

Don't Count

- **Support Positions** not directly funding by the Recovery Act that are necessary to support Recovery Act activities (e.g., accounting or HR staff funded through indirect funds).
- Indirect/Induced Jobs included retail transactions and contracts with service providers that do not require dedicated personnel.



Estimating the Number of Jobs > Reporting Jobs Data

Reporting Jobs Data

- Recipient must report jobs data on a quarterly basis, not cumulative.
- If the Recovery Act funding is **NOT** paying the salary of a staff member from the prime or subrecipient, please report **zero**.
- If Recovery Act funding is only paying for a **portion** of the wage or salary of a staff member, please report only the **portion** of the staff members FTE that is spent working on Recovery Act activities.
- Recipients must report jobs data within two data fields (Number of Jobs and Description of jobs) on the Section 1512(c) report.
 - Number of Jobs: Total number of jobs created, retained, and existing in Full-Time Equivalents (FTEs).
 - Description of Jobs: A narrative description that includes a breakdown of the numeric data and job description by the prime/subrecipient. Recipients may include the job impact of their project.



Estimating the Number of Jobs > Jobs Data



Description of Jobs

Recipients are asked to provide a narrative description in the Description of Jobs Created field to include a breakdown of numeric data by prime/subrecipient and job descriptions. DOJ suggests the following categories to classify the jobs created and retained:

- Law Enforcement
- Detention, Probation, Parole, and Community Corrections
- Policy/Research/Intelligence
- Information Technology (IT)
- Construction/Manufacturing
- Community/Social/Victim Services
- Administrative/Human Resources
- Courts/Prosecution, Defense, And Civil Attorneys
- Training and Technical Assistance

Preparing for April Reporting





How Do I Prepare for Reporting?

- Verify CCR, GMS/CMS, and FederalReporting.gov registration data.
 - Points of Contact
 - DUNS Numbers
 - Recertify CCR information annually (<u>http://www.ccr.gov</u>)
 - FRPIN
- Coordinate subrecipient data collection and/or delegation.
- Document and communicate internal procedures.
- Establish separate tracking & accounting mechanisms.
- Verify compliance with all Recovery Act Requirements/Special Conditions.





Prime Recipient Data Quality Checks

Verify control information

- Number of submissions does not exceed number of unique subrecipients
- Amount of subawards reported does not exceed total of prime award made

Check for material omissions

• Data not reported (e.g., percent of project completed, estimated number of jobs)

Check for reporting errors

- Subrecipient reports 100% project completion, but has received minimal funding
- Subrecipient reports expenditures in excess of total amount of subaward
- · Reported values show a decrease from a prior reporting period

Look for outliers

- Expended amounts reported by subrecipients are significantly over or under anticipated amounts
- Number of jobs created falls well outside the range of the number of jobs created for awards of similar value and purpose

Verify correct identifying data

- Correct DOJ award number
- Correct DUNS number

DOJ communicates errors identified in Section 1512(c)

OJP will communicate with recipients throughout the preparation submission phases. Below lists the different messages you may be receiving from OJP.

• Email Reminders from DOJ – March

(To GMS POC and Authorized Rep)

- Critical Errors (e.g., Award Number, DUNS) on December Report
- Did not submit December Report
- Quick Reference Email from DOJ March 24 (To GMS POC and Authorized Rep)
- Official Comments via FederalReporting.gov April 13-29th (To FR.gov Report Submitter Email)
- In-Depth Review by DOJ Grant Manager May/June
 - Recipients of selected reports may be contacted by their federal grant manager to provide documentation or clarification of submitted data.





DUNS Number



- Identify the DUNS number associated with the legal recipient of the award (on the award document).
- Create/Update CCR registration for legal recipient. (Verify point of contact.)
- Verify/Update **GMS profile.** (GAN required to change DUNS.)
- Verify FederalReporting.gov registration. May need to re-register using correct DUNS.





DUNS Number

- If your October December report due January 30 had an incorrect DUNS number, please verify and submit the correct data in your April report.
- DOJ validates the DUNS number with the DUNS number in GMS or CMS.
- If the DUNS number in GMS or CMS is incorrect, please submit a Grant Adjustment Notice in GMS or CMS your GMS profile or CMS profile.
- If the DUNS number in GMS or CMS is correct and the DUNS number in the Section 1512(c) report is incorrect, users can use the "Change Business Key Information" function to correct an award number.





CFDA Number and Activity Code

If your October - December report due January 30 had the <u>incorrect CFDA Number or Activity Code</u>, for the April reporting period,

- review the DOJ recommended CFDA Numbers and Activity Codes in the document entitled, "Activity Code Recommendations and CFDA Numbers," to collect the correct CFDA and Activity Code.

 - the recipient submits a closeout package in OJP's Grant Management System (GMS), and
 - the closeout package is approved in GMS.

Additional Recovery Act Requirements



Recovery Act Certifications: Section 1511

Section 1511 of the Recovery Act provides-

 With respect to covered funds made available to State or local governments for infrastructure investments, the Governor, mayor, or other chief executive, as appropriate, shall certify that the infrastructure investment has received the full review and vetting required by law and that the chief executive accepts responsibility that the infrastructure investment is an appropriate use of taxpayer dollars.



Recovery Act Certifications: Section 1511

Section 1511 of the Recovery Act provides-

- Such certification shall include a description of the investment, the estimated total cost, and the amount of covered funds to be used, and shall be posted on a website and linked to the website established by section 1526 (Recovery.gov).
- A State or local agency may not receive infrastructure investment funding from funds made available in this Act unless this certification is made and posted.



What is a Single Audit?



• All non-Federal entities that expend \$500,000 or more of Federal awards in a year (\$300,000 for fiscal year ending on or before December 30, 2003) are required to obtain an annual audit in accordance with the <u>Single Audit Act Amendments of 1996</u>, <u>OMB Circular A-133</u>, the <u>OMB Circular Compliance Supplement and Government Auditing Standards</u>.

• A single audit is intended to provide a cost-effective audit for non-Federal entities in that one audit is conducted in lieu of multiple audits of individual programs.
