1. The appropriateness of the current HHS list of select agents and toxins,

4. Whether the HHS select agent list should be tiered based on the relative bioterrorism risk of each agent or toxin, and

The University of New Mexico supports the American Biological Safety Association (ABSA) position paperaddressed to the *Working Group on Strengthening the Biosecurity of the United States, May 13-14. 2009.*

- ABSA believes that the current Select Agent Regulations are sufficiently rigorous and effective. They should not be made more prescriptive.
- Stratification of select agents is of no value; each entity must develop site-specific written security, biosafety and incident response plans.

5. Whether the security requirements for agents in the highest tier should be further stratified based on type of use or other factors.

The University of New Mexico believes that further stratification of select agents at the federal level would increase ambiguity of the current list resulting in more complexity and unnecessarily be more burdensome to our biomedical research mission. Any further stratification should remain a responsibility of our local Institutional Biosafety Committee, on a case-by-case basis.
