## Race Concepts

- Race alone population - people who reported a single race group
(e.g., White alone; Black alone)
- Race in combination population - people who reported more than one race group
(e.g., White and Black; Black and Asian)
- Race alone or in combination population all people who reported a particular race group, either alone, or in combination with one or more other race groups

## Definition of "White" Used in the 2010 Census

- According to the U.S. Office of Management and Budget, "White" refers to a person having origins in any of the original peoples of Europe, the Middle East, or North Africa.
- The "White" racial category includes respondents who marked the "White" checkbox. It also includes respondents who reported entries such as
- Caucasian or White
- European (e.g., Irish, German, Polish)
- Middle Eastern (e.g., Arab, Lebanese, Palestinian)
- North African (e.g., Algerian, Moroccan, Egyptian)

## Definition of "Black" Used in the 2010 Census

- According to the U.S. Office of Management and Budget, "Black or African American" refers to a person having origins in any of the Black racial groups of Africa.
- Includes people who marked the "Black" checkbox
- It also includes respondents who reported entries such as
- African American
- Sub-Saharan African (e.g., Kenyan and Nigerian)
- Afro-Caribbean (e.g., Haitian and Jamaican)
