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# Overview of the Older Population 

## Population Size

As of April 1, 2010:

- There were 40.3 million people 65 years and over.
- The older population represented 13.0 percent of the total population.


## Population 65 Years and Older by Sex: 2000 and 2010



## Population 65 Years and Older by Size and Percent of Total Population: 1900 to 2010



## Growth in the Older Population

Between 2000 and 2010:

- The population 65 years and over grew at a faster rate than the total population.
- The older population grew 15.1 percent (from 35.0 million to 40.3 million).
- The total population grew 9.7 percent (from 281.4 million to 308.7 million).

## Growth in the Older Population by Sex

## Between 2000 and 2010:

- Males experienced more rapid growth than females in the older ages.
- Males 65 years and older grew 20.5 percent (from 14.4 million to 17.4 million).
- Females 65 years and older grew 11.3 percent (from 20.6 million to 22.9 million).

## The Older Population by State: 2000 to 2010

- Among the 50 states, Rhode Island was the only one to exhibit a decrease in the number of people 65 years and over (declining from 152,402 in 2000 to 151,881 in 2010).
- The District of Columbia's older population also declined during the decade from 69,898 in 2000 to 68,809 in 2010.

## The Population 85 Years and Over by State: 2000 to 2010

- All states exhibited an increase in the number of people 85 years and over between 2000 and 2010.
- Alaska had the largest percent change (78.9 percent) by increasing from 2,634 in 2000 to 4,711 in 2010.
- Mississippi had the smallest percent change (3.4 percent) by increasing from 42,891 in 2000 to 44,359 in 2010.
