Definition of "Asian" Used in the 2010 Census

 According to the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB), "Asian" refers to a person having origins in any of the original peoples of the Far East, Southeast Asia, or the Indian subcontinent, including, for example, Cambodia, China, India, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, Pakistan, the Philippine Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam.

Definition of "Asian" Used in the 2010 Census

 Includes people who indicated their race as "Asian" or reported detailed entries such as "Hmong," "Laotian," "Thai," "Pakistani," and "Cambodian."



Race Concepts

- Race alone population –
 people who reported a single race group (e.g., Asian alone)
- Race in combination population –
 people who reported more than one race group (e.g., Asian and White; Asian and Black)
- Race alone or in combination population
 all people who reported a particular race group, either alone, or in combination with one or more other race groups



Percent Growth of the Asian Population: 2000 to 2010





Percentage Distribution of the Multiple-Race Asian Population: 2010




Percentage Distribution of the Multiple-Race Asian Population: 2010




GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION OF THE ASIAN POPULATION

Percentage Distribution of the Asian Population by Region: 2010





Percentage Distribution of the Asian Population by State: 2010




Top Five States With the Highest Proportion Asian Alone or in Combination: 2010




Asian Alone or in Combination as a Percentage of County Population: 2010

Top Five Places With the Highest Proportion Asian Alone or in Combination: 2010*








Percentage Distribution of the Asian Population by Detailed Group: 2010




Percentage of Largest Detailed Asian Groups Alone or in Any Combination by Number of Groups and Races: 2010




Regional Distribution of Largest Detailed Asian Groups: 2010



State Distribution of Largest Detailed Asian Groups: 2010






























Summary

- Asians were the fastest-growing race group
- Asian population concentrated in the West
- Asians represent more than 50 percent of population in Hawaii
- Among Asians, the largest multiple-race combination was Asian and White
- Chinese was largest detailed Asian group
- Among detailed Asian groups with populations of one million or more, Japanese had highest proportion reporting multiple detailed Asian groups and/or another race (41 percent)


