Transitioning from the military and starting a new career can be challenging. Let Job Corps help. At Job Corps, you can train for a new and rewarding career. After graduation, our staff will work with you to find a job for up to 21 months.

Job Corps offers hands-on training to low-income 16- through 24-year-olds in America's fastest-growing careers. Job Corps serves 60,000 young people in more than 100 career areas each year.



# Where is Job Corps?

Job Corps offers transitioning military service members priority enrollment at 125 centers across the nation. No matter where you are coming from or where you want to go, there is a Job Corps center near you.

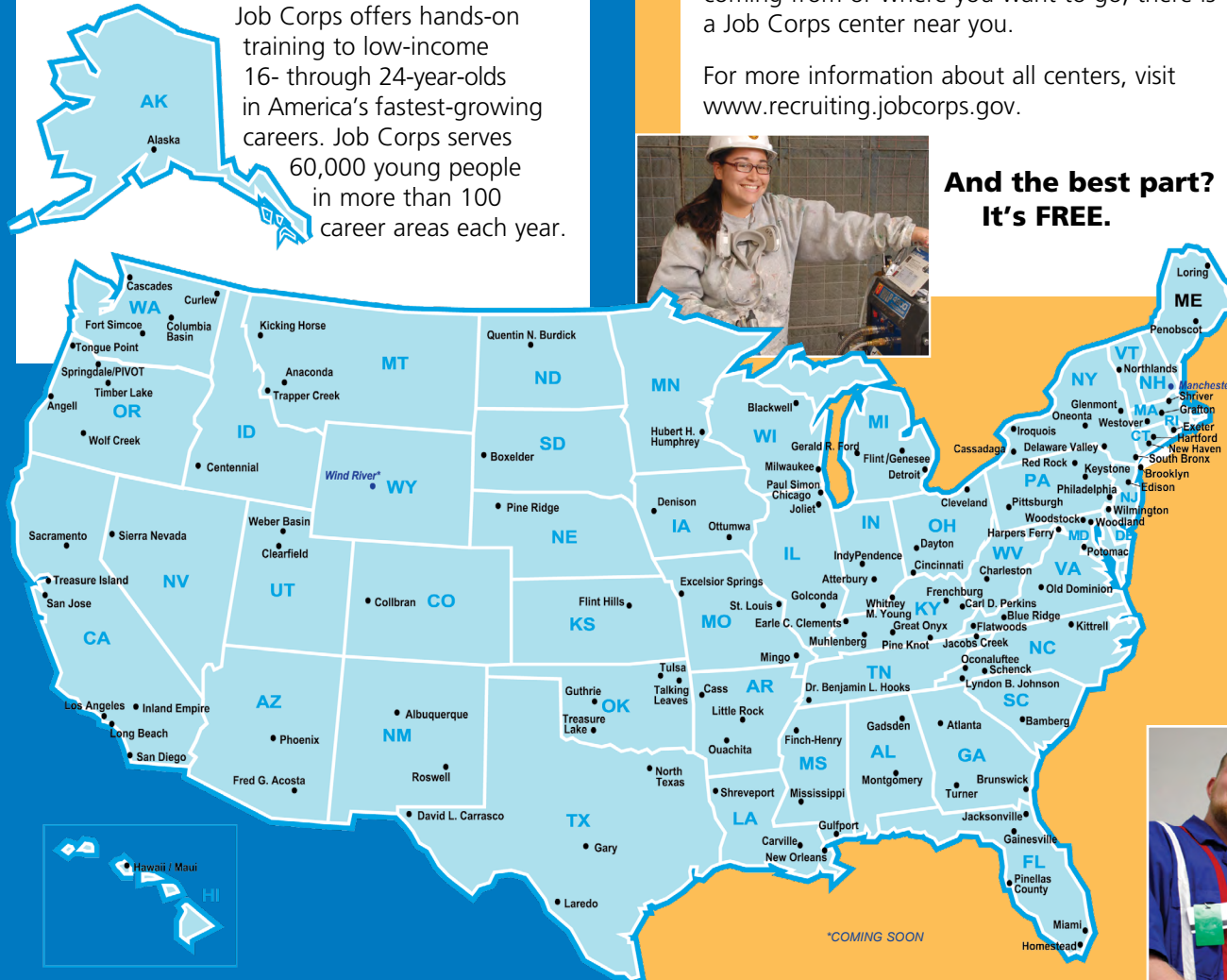


# And the best part? It's FREE.

While most of your time on center will be devoted to career training, you may spend some time taking academic classes. When you arrive you will be required to take a test to assess your academic skill level. Although you already have your high school diploma or GED, you may need to take additional classes in subjects such as math and English to prepare you for your career area.

You also will have the chance to train with professionals at actual work sites through Job Corps' Work-Based Learning Program. Job Corps works with employers in every corner of the country to provide students with real-world experience.

Once the training day is over, you may need to study or have chores to complete. In addition, there's time to relax and enjoy recreational activities. You're also eligible for weekend passes to go home and visit family and friends, or family can visit you at the center.



# Starting a new career?

One of the program's biggest benefits is its postgraduate support. When you are ready to start looking for a job, staff members will work with you to find job openings and submit resumes. Job Corps will help you for up to 21 months after you graduate to connect with housing, transportation, and child care resources.
