Center.



## Smith, Crenshaw launch new Effective Foreign Assistance Caucus


On Thursday, May 12th, Adam, along with Rep. Ander Crenshaw of Florida, kicked-off the new Congressional Caucus for Effective Foreign Assistance. Dr. Raj Shah, Administrator for USAID, was guest speaker at the event, followed by a roundtable discussion with top leaders from the NGO community.

Adam said the caucus will "help identify how to spend foreign assistance dollars more efficient-

ly and make the most of our crucial resources overseas." The goal is to examine the way the U.S. currently delivers foreign assistance, explore success stories, further the overall effectiveness of foreign assistance, and educate other Members on this subject.

Thursday's event is the first of a number of forums that will be held to examine U.S. delivery of foreign assistance.

### 2012 Defense Funding Due on Floor



On May 12th, the House Armed Services Committee passed the FY 2012 National Defense Authorization Act by a vote of 60-1. Ranking member Adam Smith made the following remarks:

"As the Armed Services Committee concludes its mark up of the FY 2012 National Defense Authorization Act, I would like to thank Chairman McKeon, the members of the committee, and staff for their hard work and dedication to the well-being of our service men and women.

"This bill provides our military with the resources and equipment necessary to accomplish their missions and safeguard national security, while also ensuring our troops and their families have support at home that reflects their incredible sacrifice for our nation.

"As we move to the floor later this month, I look forward to continuing this conversation with the rest of our colleagues in Congress, while keeping in mind our paramount responsibility to provide resources for our military personnel and their families."

### Highlights of the 2012 Defense Authorization:

- 1.6% pay raise for military personnel.
- Gives authority to the Secretary of Defense to create apprenticeship programs to help members of the armed forces who wish to transition to civilian careers.
- \$511 million authorized for Washington State Military Construction Projects.

# Smith Congratulates Art Competition Students
