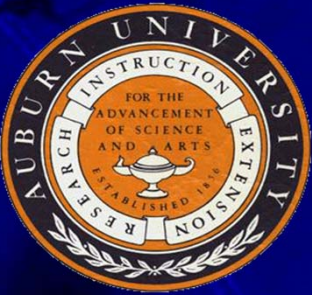

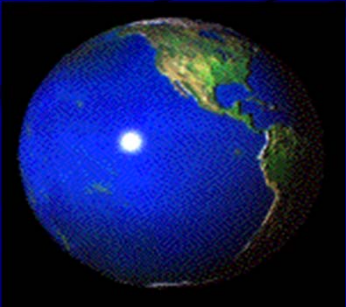

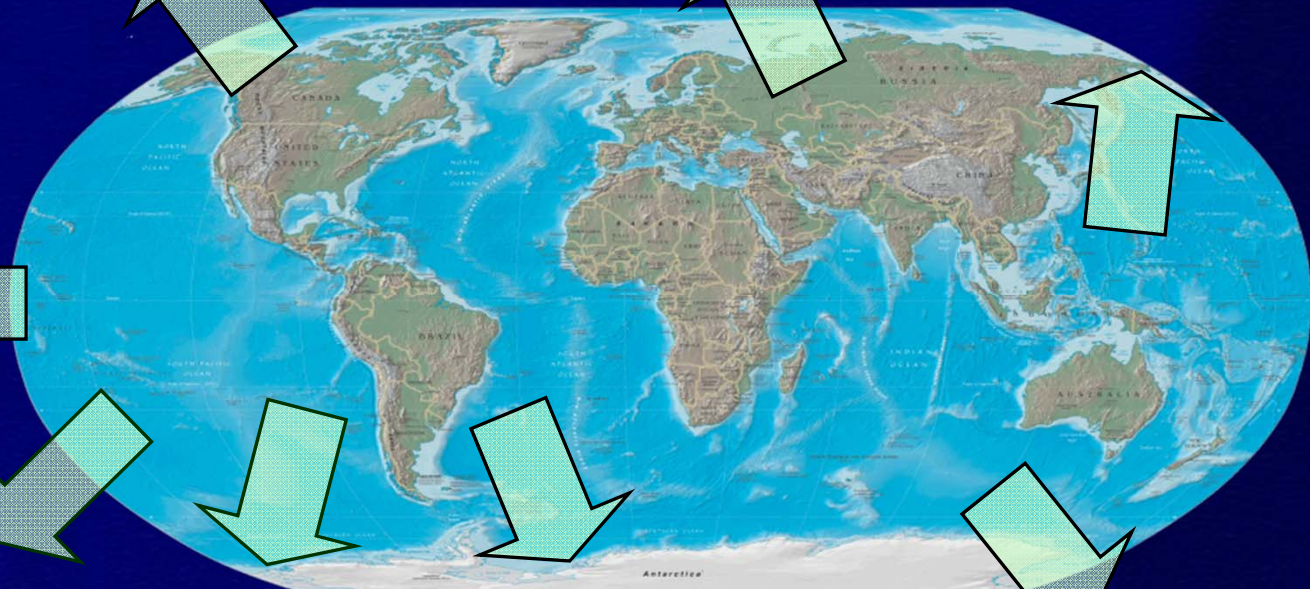

Total Suspended Solids and Stream Discharge Monitoring





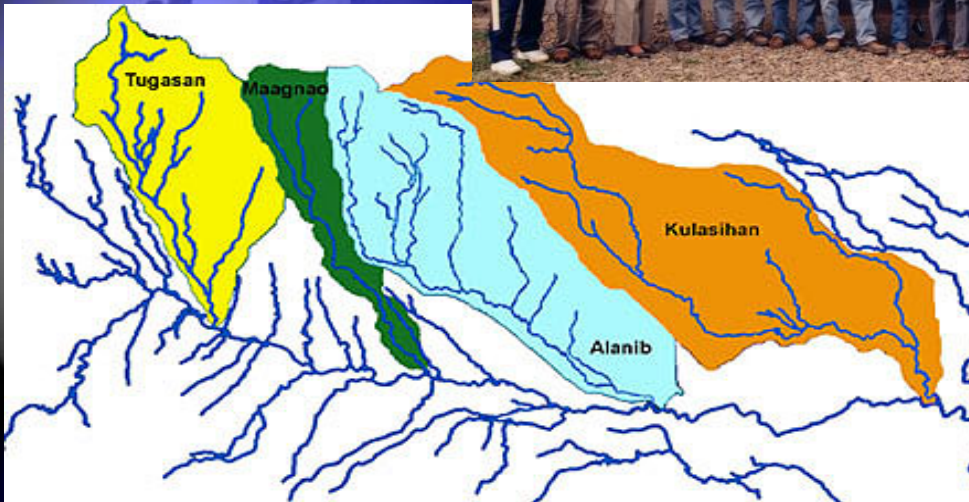
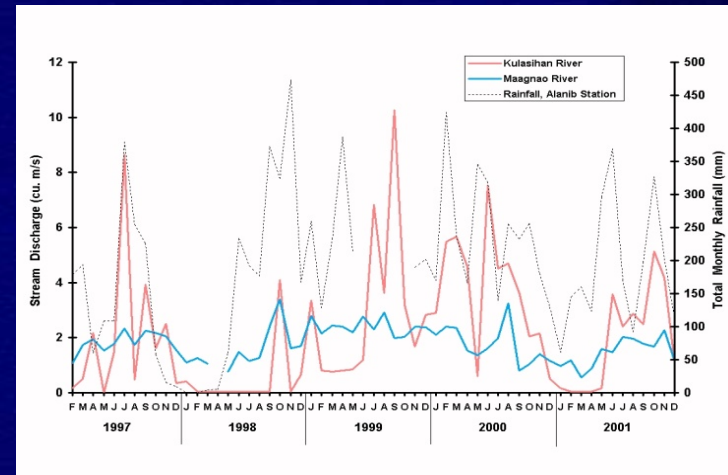

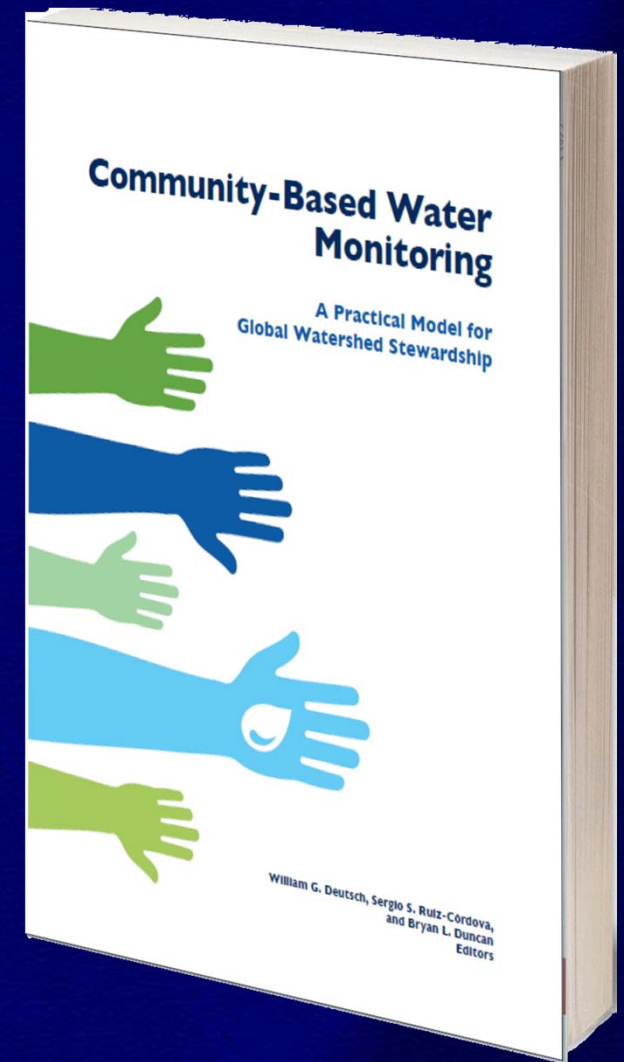


Water Availability increased through Water Harvesting
