## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report provides the overviews and summaries for the DoD Key Acquisition and Technology Workforce (A&TWF) based on September 30, 1999 Defense Manpower Data Center (DMDC) data. The DoD Key A&TWF consisted of 138,851 civilian and military personnel as of September 30, 1999.

In his April 1997 testimony to the Congress, the Acting Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition and Technology, USD(A&T), committed to develop a better way of identifying the DoD Acquisition Workforce (AWF). In May 1997, OUSD(A&T) contracted with Jefferson Solutions to review alternative ways of identifying the DoD AWF.

Jefferson Solutions recommended that the DoD AWF could be best identified using an updated and refined version of the approach utilized by the 1986 President's Blue Ribbon Commission on Defense Management (Packard Commission). The Jefferson Solutions methodology is detailed in its September 1997 Report. It builds on the original Packard Commission algorithm of using a combined occupational and organizational approach for identifying the DoD AWF.

In an 18 December 1997 letter, the Secretary of Defense (SecDef) forwarded the Jefferson Solutions September 1997 Report to the Congress, stating that beginning October 1, 1998, members of the AWF will be uniformly identified using the updated and refined Packard approach.

In December 1997, a DoD Acquisition Workforce Identification Working Group was formed to comply with the direction contained in the 18 December 1997 SecDef letter, to refine the Packard approach. From December 1997 through March 1998, the Working Group updated and refined the new AWF identification methodology.

The Acquisition Workforce Identification Working Group made many useful refinements to the identification model to make the workforce determination as accurate as possible. Lessons learned from an initial count were incorporated into the model. USD(A&T) memorandum, dated 20 November 1998, tasked the Services and Agencies to conduct a second count. Results of the initial and second counts are contained in Solutions April 1999 Report, "Identification of the DoD Key Acquisition and Technology Workforce". This memorandum also directed that the count for the DoD Key A&TWF be updated annually during the first few years of implementation.

The Refined Packard algorithm for identifying the DoD Key Acquisition and Technology Workforce can be briefly stated as follows:

- All occupations listed in Category I (e.g., Contracting) must be counted across DoD.
- All occupations listed in Category IIA or IIB (e.g., Electronics Engineering) must be counted whenever they are located in a listed Group IIA or IIB organization, respectively.
- All military Officers located in a listed Group IIA or IIB organization are to be considered part of the Workforce.
- All applicable key enlisted acquisition and technology positions should be added to the Workforce using Category III capability.
- All DAWIA positions, not captured above, must be added to the Workforce using Category III capability.
- Category III capability should also be used to add any key acquisition and technology positions not captured above, or to delete any (except Category I positions) that are not considered applicable.

As stated, as of September 30, 1999, the DoD Key A&TWF consisted of 138,851 civilian and military personnel. For comparison purposes, the DoD Key A&TWF, as of September 30, 1998, consisted of 146,071 civilian and military personnel.

For various reasons, the Services were unable for this Count to provide specific data (e.g., SSNs) for those Science and Technology (S&T) Performers that need to be deleted from the Key A&TWF, in accordance with the recent DACM decision to not include bench scientists in the A&TWF workforce. However, the following Service estimates, for S&T Performers, could be used to reduce the Service workforce numbers, contained in this Report:

- for Army - delete 935 civilians from ARL,
- for Navy - delete 1,990 civilians from ONR,
- and for Air Force - delete 1,936 civilians from AFRL.

Reducing the count by these 4,861 S&T Performers, would yield a DoD Key A&TWF Count of 133,990, as of September 30, 1999. Due to their small numbers, DTRA and DARPA were not required to provide an estimate of their S&T Performers at this time. A uniform adjustment to accommodate this DACM decision, will be developed for future Counts.
