

Open Government Annual Status Report

March 2012

The National Capital Planning Commission is committed to transforming itself into an open, collaborative and transparent organization. In March 2011, we published our first Open Government Plan, which outlined a number of initiatives to help the agency increase participation and improve customer service. We want to share the progress we've made since then in meeting the goals in the plan.

In the past year, we have successfully launched a number of planned initiatives, and made important strides towards other goals – particularly in the area of public participation and engagement. Since we first published our Open Government Plan, NCPC has embraced Twitter, begun streaming Commission meetings and events over the Internet, engaged the public via various online commenting and crowdsourcing tools, and created an online map of memorials in Washington.

Work remains to be done however to provide the public with easier and greater access to the Commission's records and data. Promisingly, a number of critical IT systems – particularly NCPC's central projects database – are undergoing improvements and upgrades that will allow the agency to provide enhanced and up-to-date information about the projects the Commission reviews on its website. These upgrades are underway, with completion scheduled by the end of 2012.

Beyond the specific new initiatives in the open government plan, the agency has for the first time begun to collect and track data about the agency's interactions with the public – both on- and off-line. These metrics will help NCPC evaluate the success of its open government efforts, and allow the agency to focus on those with the most adoption by the public.

Going forward, we are excited to apply the lessons learned from both our successes and missteps as we continue to explore how the agency can further inform and empower citizens to help us enhance the cultural, historic and natural resources of the nation's capital.
