Fort Stewart, Ga. – "I'm proud to be back," said Private First Class Perry Oxendine, under a scorching sun on Monday at the Urban Operations training lane.

As the 41st Infantry Brigade Combat Team makes its final runs through the training gauntlet provided by First Army and the mobilization team at Fort Stewart, Pfc. Oxendine and other Individual Ready Reserve (IRR) Soldiers are stepping in to complete the mission that lies ahead.

The unit has several IRR Soldiers who have joined them recently, and according to Capt. Rapp, they are a great fit.

The urban operations lane is a great chance to enhance their skills, learn from their leaders, and better prepare every Soldier in the unit, new and old, for the mission ahead.
