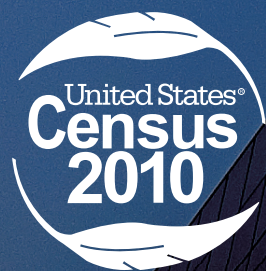
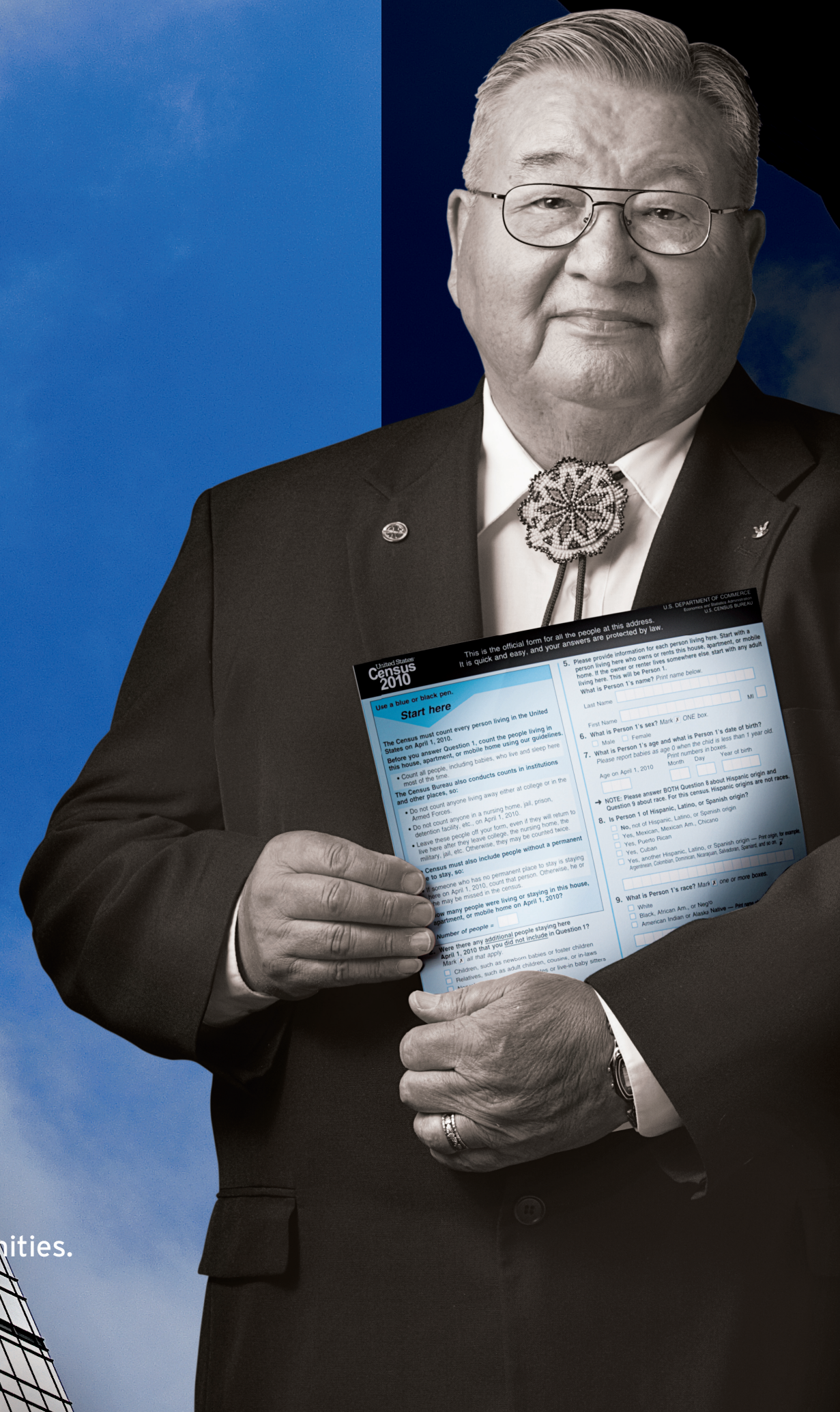

The Census must count every person living in the United States on April 1, 2010.  
Before you answer Question 1, count the people living in this house, apartment, or mobile home using our questions.  
• Count all people, including babies, who live and sleep here most of the time.  
• The Census Bureau also counts people in institutions such as colleges, prisons, and nursing homes.  
• Do not count anyone living away from home on April 1, 2010, such as Armed Forces members, college students, or people in long-term care facilities.  
• Leave these people off your form, even if they will return here after they leave college, the nursing home, or the military, etc. Otherwise, they may be counted twice.

Census must also include people without a permanent place to stay, such as:  
• People who have no permanent place to stay or are staying in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing on April 1, 2010.  
• People who are living or staying in this house, apartment, or mobile home on April 1, 2010.
