OCS Operations Safety Alert Fatality -- Man Knocked Overboard

An accident occurred recently on an offshore drilling rig which resulted in a crewman being knocked overboard and drowned.

The drilling crew was dismantling equipment around the wellhead in the keyway area of the rig. A floorman wearing a lifejacket and safety belt with safety blocks was preparing to attach the safety blocks when the end of the flowline swung around and knocked him overboard. He remained afloat for a short period of time, but submerged before he could be rescued.

To prevent a recurrence of this accident, the operator has taken the following action:

- 1. The operator's drilling representatives have been instructed to insure that safe practices are employed in their rig work.
- 2. The drilling contractor has been instructed to rig safety nets in the keyway area.
- 3. The drilling contractor has been instructed to rig lines across the keyway to permit snapping on the safety blocks prior to entering the keyway.
- 4. The drilling contractor has been instructed to snub flowlines to the floor to prevent them from swinging across the keyway.
