SUBJECT: FEBRUARY MEETING

There will be a meeting of the Domestic Policy Council on Friday, February 14 from 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. in the Roosevelt Room.

As you recall, at the last cabinet meeting, the Chief of Staff asked each Secretary to review second-term priorities in light of the President's State of the Union address. He also has asked the various Policy Councils to meet with their member agencies in order to discuss these priorities. I hope to use this discussion to seek your help on a number of concrete projects, including promoting the President's 10-point education plan, creating work opportunities for welfare recipients, and providing assistance to the D.C. government. I also will give you an update and seek further advice on the 0-3 conference we talked about at our last meeting.

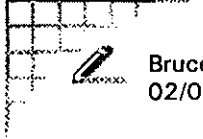



At the Cabinet meeting Monday, I asked each of the Cabinet Secretaries to review the presentations describing the second term priorities for their departments. These presentations were prepared by their departments in late November of 1996 for Leon Panetta. Having completed this review, I asked them to listen carefully to the President's State of the Union speech in which he will describe what his priorities are for the Administration. Then they could take a fresh look at their department's priorities in light of the President's agenda and see if some reordering might make sense.

I went on to ask them to be prepared to meet next week with their respective Policy Councils to review their plans. Two weeks from now we will meet again in a Cabinet briefing session and each Secretary will be asked to briefly describe how their department will help accomplish the President's agenda. From that discussion, we should be able to define success; in other words, what we plan to do to build the President's legacy.

I would appreciate it if each of you would meet with the various members of your Council next week to discuss their priorities in light of the President's State of the Union address. Having done such, I anticipate an interesting meeting two weeks from now when the Cabinet members tell us the steps they need to take to accomplish the President's mission and build his legacy.

SUBJECT: JANUARY MEETING

There will be a meeting of the Domestic Policy Council on Wednesday, January 29 from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. in the Roosevelt Room. We will discuss the State of the Union Speech and an upcoming White House meeting on early childhood education.

The State of the Union is scheduled for February 4. The Council meeting will provide a formal opportunity for Council members to discuss the policy initiatives that should be included in the speech. Council members should feel free to submit written suggestions regarding the speech either before or at the meeting.

The White House is planning a meeting for early this spring on learning in very young children, especially between the ages of 0 and 3. The meeting will address recent scientific research and its practical applications. In preparation for the meeting, the President will ask agency heads to review and develop policy initiatives to advance learning in the early childhood years.

I apologize for the late notice of this meeting, but I wanted to make sure we had a chance to get together before the State of the Union.
