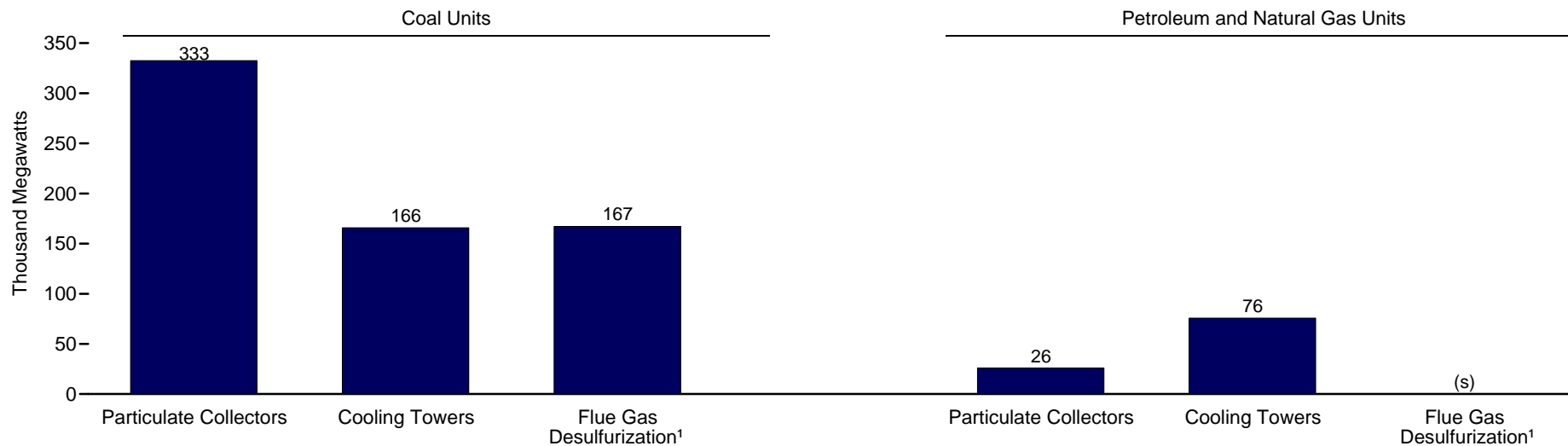
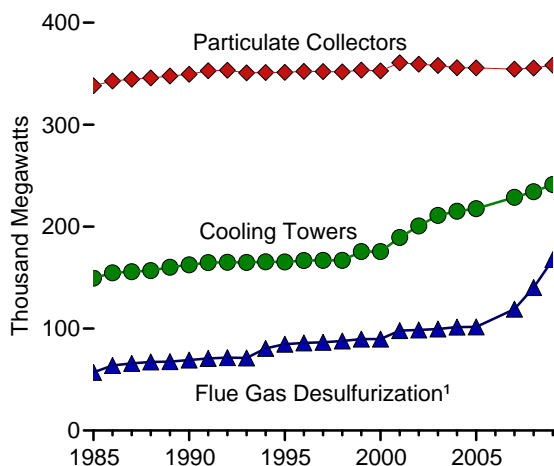


Figure 11.7 Installed Nameplate Capacity of Fossil-Fuel Steam-Electric Generators With Environmental Equipment

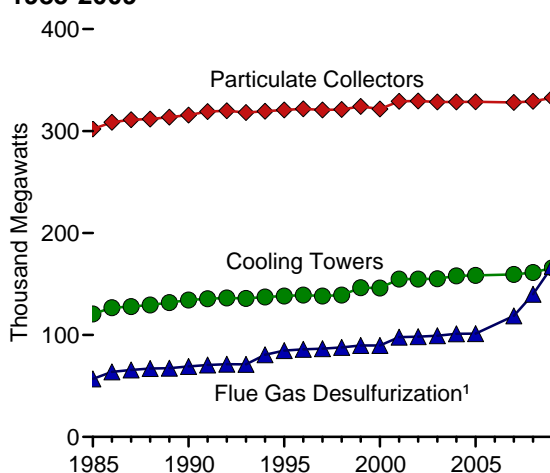

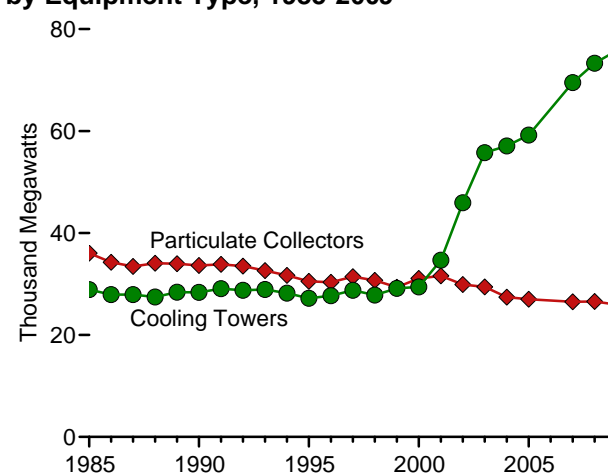
Total Units by Equipment Type, 1985-2009²
