NRC ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON MEDICAL USES OF ISOTOPES TO MEET APRIL 28-29

The Nuclear Regulatory Commission's Advisory Committee on Medical Uses of Isotopes will meet April 28-29 to discuss several issues, including a transition plan for NRC to regulate naturally-occurring and accelerator-produced radioactive material, recommendations on regulating the Leksell Gamma-Knife® Perfexion™; potential revisions to the NRC's abnormal occurrence criteria; guidance for yttrium-90 microsphere brachtherapy sources and devices; status of specialty board applications for NRC recognition; and review of recent medical events.
