

RESPONSE BOAT-SMALL

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Coast Guard is replacing its Response Boat-Small (RB-S) fleet. The Response Boat-Small is a multi-mission platform, used for the full range of Coast Guard missions, including: search and rescue; vessel boarding team deployment and law enforcement missions; port security; drug and migrant interdiction and environmental response operations.

The RB-S II, designed with an increased emphasis on function and crew comfort, will gradually replace the Defender-class RB-S as the older assets reach the end of their service life. The RB-S replacement is one of the largest boat buys of its type for the Coast Guard. The service plans to procure up to 500 new RB-S units, with as many as 20 of those being delivered to U.S. Customs and Border Protection and 10 to the U.S. Navy.
