


• In the three months that ended in December 2010 employment increased by 4,945 in New England. In the previous quarter employment increased by 11,932 jobs.

• The net change in private sector jobs was positive in four of the six New England states.

• Private sector net job growth in December 2010 was less than half of that seen in the previous quarter.

Expanding establishments accounted for the majority of job gains, 280,311. There were 60,520 jobs created from the opening of new establishments.
Contracting establishments accounted for the majority of job losses, 273,782. There were 62,104 job losses resulting from the closing of establishments.
Net job decreases were substantial during the 2001 recession, but were surpassed during the most recent recession (December 2007 — June 2009).
