<u>Audience</u>: Staff of state Medicaid agencies, state health and human services agencies, MFP Project Directors, State Housing Finance Agencies or other state housing agencies, and other people who are interested in securing housing with long term supportive services for individuals transitioning from institutions to the community.

Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA): On May 15, 2012, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development published the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for HUD's Fiscal Year 2012 Section 811 Supportive Housing for Persons with Disabilities Project Rental Assistance Demonstration (PRA Demo) Program. Applications are due July 31, 2012.

The PRA Demo NOFA announces the availability – for the first time – of \$85 million in Section 811 PRA Demo funding to identify, stimulate, and support innovative state-level partnerships and strategies that will transform and increase affordable and permanent supportive housing for extremely low income persons with disabilities. HUD expects to grant 9-16 awards, with a minimum of \$2 million and a maximum of \$12 million.

Eligible housing agency applicants are required to include in their applications, formal agreements with the State Medicaid agency and/or state health/human services agency that provides services, such as those provided under Medicaid waivers for community based care and for certain populations.

What you will learn in this webinar: The role of the State Medicaid agencies, MFP and other programs, in collaboration with state housing agencies in the application and implementation process, and next steps.
