• 2002: The Sport Fishing and Boating Partnership Council recommended a "national aquatic habitat plan" modeled after the North American Waterfowl Management Plan



Action Plan Objectives

- Protect all healthy and intact habitats by 2015.
- Improve the condition of 90 percent of priority habitats and species targeted by Fish Habitat Partnerships by 2020.
- Establish 12 or more Fish Habitat Partnerships throughout United States by 2010.
- Conduct condition analysis of all fish habitats within the United States by 2010.
- Prepare a Status of Fish Habitats in the United States in 2010, and every five years thereafter.



National Fish Habitat Board

- First met in Sept of 2006
- 22 members from 5 states, 4 federal agencies (including NOAA), tribes, FMCs and Interstate Commissions, NGOs (including NFWF), academia, and private interests
- Responsible for guiding and supporting implementation of the Action Plan
- Currently funded primarily by grants, legislation is being developed to provide Congressional funding



Fish Habitat Partnerships

- Primary work units of the Action Plan
- Diverse array of public, private, and non-private entities
- Self-identified, self-directed
- Formed around
 - distinct geographic areas
 - keystone fish species
 - system types

National Fish Habitat Conservation Act

- Under development by Legislative Subcommittee of the Board
- Based on:
 - North American Wetland Conservation Act
 - National Fish Habitat Board charter
 - Desire to make NFHAP a permanent program in FWS, NMFS, and USGS



Major Provisions

Establishes Board and Exec Leadership Team based on Board charter

Process for approval of FHPS by Board

Process for recommendation of projects to be funded through Sec of Interior

Establishes NFHAP implementation programs in NMFS, FWS, and USGS

Authorizes appropriations for projects and % for Board, NMFS, FWS, and USGS



Role of Councils

From Board charter, and draft NFHCA
"There shall be established a National Fish
Habitat Board...eight members shall be
appointed to ensure the Board includes
distinct representation from each of the
following range of interests: sportfishing,
commercial fishing....."
