

TARGET POPULATION

These grants are targeted to serve both in-school youth from the eighth through the twelfth grade and high school dropouts through age 21 who are, have been, or are at high risk of involvement in gangs or the juvenile justice system due to:

- poor school performance and attendance;
- a real or perceived lack of employment and career opportunities;
- the negative influence of peer pressure and the lack of positive community-based supports that push these youth to make choices that negatively influence their future employment and economic success; and
- a of lack of integration and coordination between youth serving systems, including the public school system to support academic achievement and future career opportunities.
