1	Commission, I can't recall a time when we received so
2	many petitions in such a short period of time.
3	We'll see the staff in front of us at the
4	tables today for the two votes today and the three
5	votes on Monday, and I just wanted to take this
6	opportunity to thank everyone for all their hard work
7	for what's been a very time crunch period.
8	And I also want to take the time to note
9	that many people throughout the agency contributed to
10	the successful completion of these investigations.
11	There are folks in the Office of the Secretary who
12	coordinated five staff conferences and votes over two
13	days, those in Dockets for processing and releasing
14	hundreds of documents, to our print shop for getting
15	all five preliminary reports printed in one day, and
16	to those in the Statistical Services Division of the
17	Office of Investigations, as well as research
18	assistants in the Office of Economics, for helping
19	ensure that the investigative process was successfully
20	completed within the statutory time table.
21	Teamwork has always been a strong attribute
22	of the Commission and our employees and this is an
23	example of it, and I want to thank all of you who
24	contributed. A round of applause for the staff.
