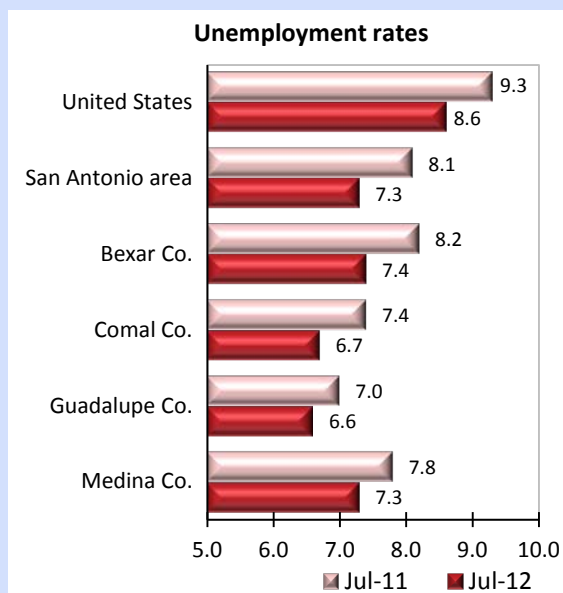

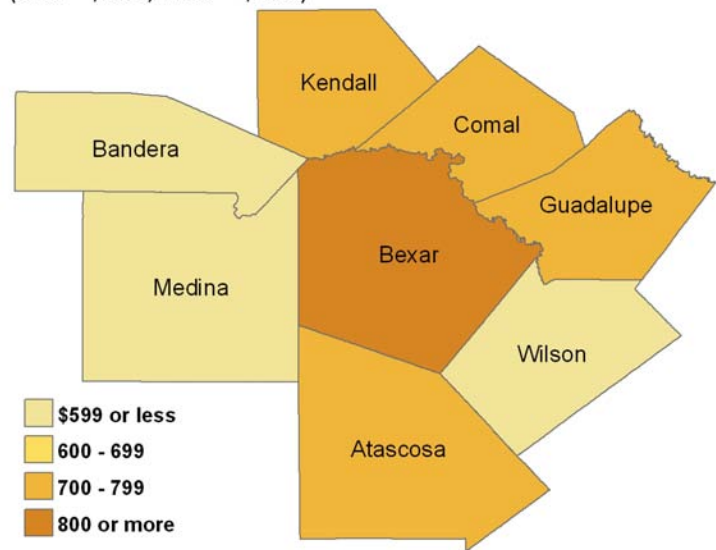
Unemployment rates for the San Antonio area, selected area counties, and the nation

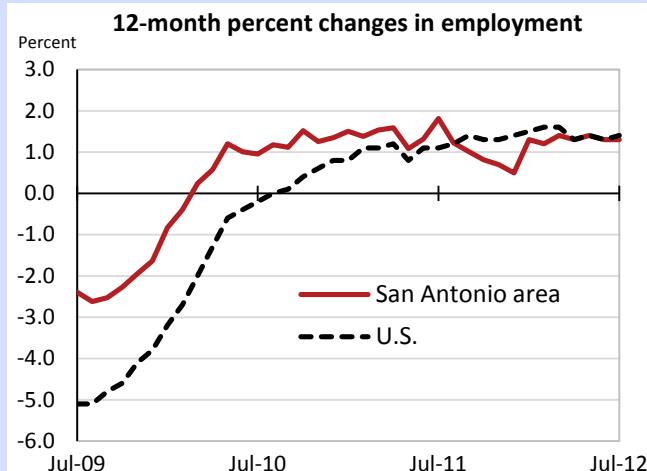
Average weekly wages for all industries by county

Over-the-year changes in employment on nonfarm payrolls and employment by major industry sector

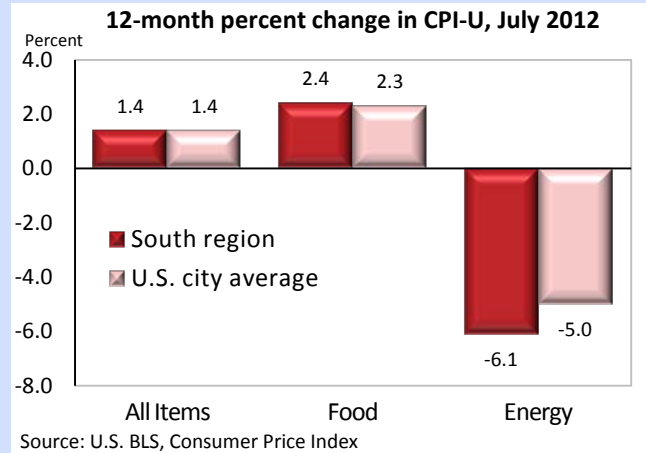

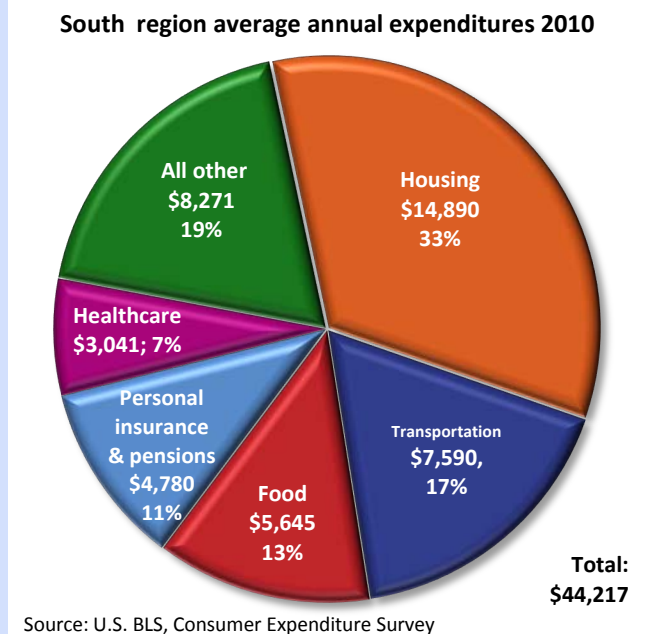

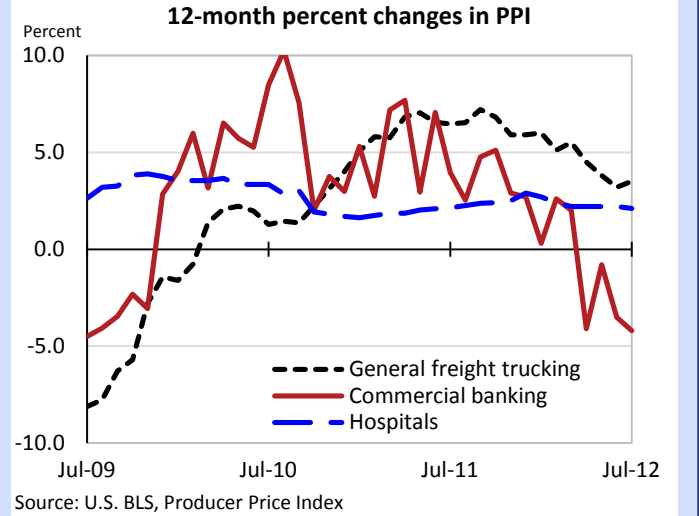
Over-the-year change in the prices paid by urban consumers for selected categories
