Commission must make two affirmative determinations. 1 First, it must determine that delay in taking action 2 would cause damage to the relevant domestic industry 3 4 that would be difficult to repair. Second, if the first determination is 5 affirmative, then the Commission must make a 6 preliminary determination of whether imports of the 7 subject product have caused or threatened to cause 8 9 market disruption. Finally, if both of these determinations are 10 affirmative then the affirmative voting Commissioners 11 will make recommendations on proposed provisional 12 13 measures to prevent or remedy market disruption. 14 Accordingly, the first vote will be on whether delay in taking action would cause damage that 15 would be difficult to repair. The Commission will 16 17 proceed to the next determination only if the first vote is affirmative or evenly divided. 18 19 Madam Secretary, will you please call the roll? 20 MS. ABBOTT: Commissioner Okun? 21
