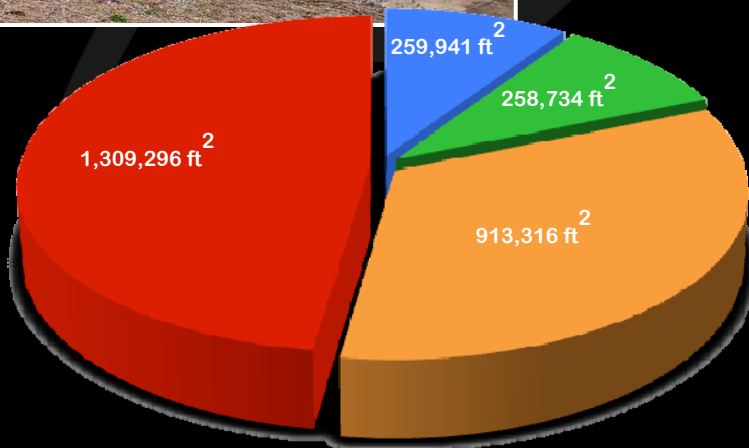
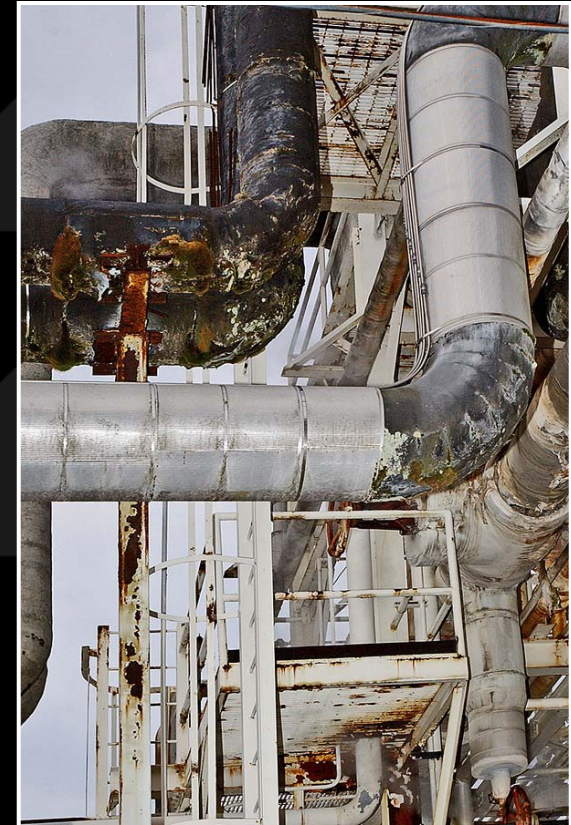

Vendor Information Database

Attention Vendors: The purpose of this database is to obtain capability information on vendors who are interested in doing business with B&W Y-12. It *does not* pre-qualify you or guarantee you will receive subcontracts.

This *is not* the official Vendor Master Database maintained by the B&W Y-12 Procurement Organization. If you presently have a subcontract with B&W Y-12 that needs updating (i.e., name, address, SB status, etc.), you must contact the Procurement Subcontract Administrator associated with your subcontract to make the necessary changes.

Instructions: To add a new entry in the Vendor Information Database

- Be sure you have your corporate Dun & Bradstreet number, which is required to complete the questionnaire. Go to the [Dun & Bradstreet Web Site](#) to get a number, if needed.
- The following are **required fields** that you will need to complete before your information can be saved and a password issued:
 - Company name and complete address
 - Point of contact name and e-mail address
 - Small business concern classification (i.e., SB, SDB, WOB, etc.)
 - Material groups
 - Dun & Bradstreet number
 - Name and telephone number of individual completing questionnaire.

ARIBA - eSourcing

- NNSA chartered the Supply Chain Management Center (SCMC) in an effort to develop NNSA-wide strategic sourcing strategies to achieve significant cost savings.
- Among the tools offered was a NNSA enterprise system that included eSourcing, “ARIBA”.
- The eSourcing system allows buyers to conduct electronic procurement bidding, including reverse auctions, sealed bids, and sealed bids with rank. The system permits suppliers to either compare their price to the actual lowest bid price (as found on Reverse Auctions) or it allows the supplier to see their overall “rank” as it relates to pricing (as found on Sealed Bid with Rank). These eSourcing tools help achieve better pricing from suppliers, ensures uniform price for comparable goods and services, and streamlines and reduces the total cost of acquisition.
